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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 3A O.S. 2011, Section 713, as
14	amended by Section 27, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (3A O.S. Supp. 2016,
15	Section 713), is amended to read as follows:
16	Section 713. A. All gross proceeds shall be the property of
17	the Oklahoma Lottery Commission. From its gross proceeds, the
18	Commission shall pay the operating expenses of the Commission. At
19	least forty-five percent (45%) of gross proceeds shall be made
20	available as prize money. However, the provisions of this
21	subsection shall be deemed not to create any lien, entitlement,
22	cause of action, or other private right, and any rights of holders
23	of tickets or shares shall be determined by the Commission in
24	setting the terms of its lottery or lotteries.

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1 B. For each fiscal year, the first Fifty Million Dollars 2 (\$50,000,000.00) of net proceeds shall equal at least thirty-five 3 percent (35%) of the gross proceeds. However, for the purpose of 4 repaying indebtedness issued pursuant to Section 732 of this title, 5 for the first two (2) full fiscal years and any partial first fiscal 6 year of the Commission, net proceeds need only equal at least thirty 7 percent (30%) of the gross proceeds be transferred to the Oklahoma 8 Education Lottery Trust Fund.

9 C. All of the net proceeds remaining after the apportionment required by subsection B of this section shall be transferred to the 10 11 Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund as provided in subsection B 12 Section 2 of this section act. The Oklahoma Lottery Commission shall submit a written report of its findings and any 13 recommendations regarding the impact of having the net proceeds 14 15 minimum requirement set at a fixed dollar amount. The report shall 16 be submitted to the Governor, the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State 17 Senate not later than October 1, 2019, and annually thereafter. 18 B. D. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a fund to 19 be designated the "Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund". Except 20

21 as otherwise provided in subsections  $\frac{H}{C}$ , J and  $\frac{1}{K}$  of this section, 22 on or before the fifteenth day of each calendar quarter, the 23 Commission shall transfer to the State Treasurer, for credit to the 24 Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund, the amount of all net

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1 proceeds accruing during the preceding calendar quarter.

2 Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the 3 State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the 4 Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for 5 approval and payment.

6 E. Upon their deposit into the State Treasury, any monies 7 representing a deposit of net proceeds shall then become the unencumbered property of this state, and neither the Commission nor 8 9 the board of trustees shall have the power to agree or undertake 10 otherwise. The monies shall be invested by the State Treasurer in 11 accordance with state investment practices. All earnings attributable to such investments shall likewise be the unencumbered 12 property of the state and shall accrue to the credit of the fund 13 funds provided for in subsections B and C of this section. 14

15 C. F. Monies in the Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund 16 <u>deposited pursuant to subsection B of this section</u> shall only be 17 appropriated as follows:

18 1. Forty-five percent (45%) for the following:

a. kindergarten through twelfth grade public education,
including but not limited to compensation and benefits
for public school teachers and support employees, and
b. early childhood development programs, which shall
include but not be limited to costs associated with
prekindergarten and full-day kindergarten programs;

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2. Forty-five percent (45%) for the following:

2 tuition grants, loans and scholarships to citizens of a. this state to enable such citizens to attend colleges 3 and universities located within this state, regardless 4 5 of whether such colleges and universities are owned or operated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 6 7 Education, or to attend institutions operated under the authority of the Oklahoma Department of Career and 8 9 Technology Education; provided such tuition grants, 10 loans and scholarships shall not be made to a citizen of this state to attend a college or university which 11 12 is not accredited by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, 13

- b. construction of educational facilities for elementary
  school districts, independent school districts, The
  Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, and career
  and technology education,
- c. capital outlay projects for elementary school
   districts, independent school districts, The Oklahoma
   State System of Higher Education, and career and
   technology education,
- d. technology for public elementary school district,
   independent school district, state higher education,
   and career and technology education facilities, which

1 shall include but not be limited to costs of providing 2 to teachers at accredited public institutions who 3 teach levels kindergarten through twelfth grade, personnel at technology centers under the authority of 4 5 the Oklahoma State Department of Career and Technology Education, and professors and instructors within The 6 7 Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, the necessary training in the use and application of 8 9 computers and advanced electronic instructional 10 technology to implement interactive learning environments in the classroom and to access the state-11 12 wide statewide distance learning network and costs associated with repairing and maintaining advanced 13 electronic instructional technology, 14 endowed chairs for professors at institutions of 15 e. higher education operated by The Oklahoma State System 16 of Higher Education, and 17 f. programs and personnel of the Oklahoma School for the 18 Deaf and the Oklahoma School for the Blind: 19 3. Five percent (5%) to the School Consolidation and Assistance 20 Fund. When the total amount in the School Consolidation and 21

Assistance Fund from all sources equals Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00), all monies appropriated pursuant to this paragraph which would otherwise be deposited in the School Consolidation and

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1 Assistance Fund in excess of Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) 2 shall be allocated by the State Department of Education to public 3 schools based on the audited end-of-year average daily membership in grades 8 through 12 during the preceding school year for the purpose 4 5 of purchasing technology equipment in order to conduct on-line testing as required by the Achieving Classroom Excellence Act of 6 2005. If at any time the total amount in the School Consolidation 7 and Assistance Fund drops below Five Million Dollars 8 9 (\$5,000,000.00), the monies appropriated pursuant to this paragraph 10 shall be deposited in the School Consolidation and Assistance Fund 11 until the Fund again reaches Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000 12 (\$5,000,000.00); and 4. Five percent (5%) to the Teachers' Retirement System 13 Dedicated Revenue Revolving Fund. 14 15 In no instance shall the annual maximum percentage for 16 administrative costs, not including marketing and advertising costs, funds set aside for prizes, commissions paid to retailers, contract 17 fees paid to gaming system vendors and instant ticket providers or 18 emergency-related capital expenses, exceed three percent (3%) of 19 20 sales. The Legislature shall appropriate funds from the Oklahoma 21 <del>D.</del> G. Education Lottery Trust Fund only for the purposes specified in 22 subsection  $\in$  F of this section and Section 2 of this act. Even when 23 funds from the trust fund are used for these purposes, the 24

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Legislature shall not use funds from the trust fund to supplant or
 replace other state funds supporting common education, higher
 education, or career and technology education.

In order to ensure that the funds from the trust fund are 4 <del>Е.</del> Н. 5 used to enhance and not supplant funding for education, the State Board of Equalization shall examine and investigate appropriations 6 from the trust fund each year. At the meeting of the State Board of 7 Equalization held within five (5) days after the monthly 8 9 apportionment in February of each year, the State Board of 10 Equalization shall issue a finding and report which shall state 11 whether appropriations from the trust fund were used to enhance or 12 supplant education funding. If the State Board of Equalization finds that education funding was supplanted by funds from the trust 13 fund, the Board shall specify the amount by which education funding 14 15 was supplanted. In this event, the Legislature shall not make any appropriations for the ensuing fiscal year until an appropriation in 16 that amount is made to replenish the trust fund. 17

18 F. I. Except as otherwise provided by this subsection, no
19 deficiency in the Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund shall be
20 replenished by reducing any nonlottery funds, including specifically
21 but without limitation, the General Revenue Fund, the Constitutional
22 Reserve Fund or the Education Reform Revolving Fund of the State
23 Department of Education. No program or project started specifically
24 from lottery proceeds shall be continued from the General Revenue

1 Fund, the Constitutional Reserve Fund or the Education Reform 2 Revolving Fund of the State Department of Education. Such programs 3 must be adjusted or discontinued according to available lottery proceeds unless the Legislature by general law establishes 4 5 eligibility requirements and appropriates specific funds therefor. No surplus in the Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund shall be 6 7 reduced or transferred to correct any nonlottery deficiencies in sums available for general appropriations. The provisions of this 8 9 subsection shall not apply to bonds or other obligations issued 10 pursuant to or to the repayment of bonds or other obligations issued 11 pursuant to the Oklahoma Higher Education Promise of Excellence Act 12 of 2005.

G. J. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving 13 fund to be designated the "Oklahoma Education Lottery Revolving 14 15 Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the 16 Commission. The Commission shall make payments of net proceeds from 17 the fund to the Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund on or before 18 the fifteenth day of each calendar quarter as provided in subsection 19 B D of this section. All monies accruing to the credit of the 20 Oklahoma Education Lottery Revolving Fund are hereby appropriated 21 and may be budgeted and expended for the payment of net proceeds, 22 prizes, commissions to retailers, administrative expenses and all 23 other expenses arising out of the operation of the education 24

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lottery, subject to the limitations provided in the Oklahoma
 Education Lottery Act. Expenditures from the fund shall be made
 upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as
 prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and
 Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

6 The monies in the fund shall be invested by the State Treasurer 7 in accordance with state investment practices. All earnings 8 attributable to such investments shall likewise accrue to the credit 9 of the fund.

10 H. K. When appropriations from the Oklahoma Education Lottery 11 Trust Fund are made to common education pursuant to the provisions 12 of paragraph 1 of subsection  $\in$  F of this section, the appropriations shall be made available on a monthly basis. In addition to the 13 provisions of subsection B subsections D and E of this section, the 14 15 following process shall be used to insure ensure that the 16 appropriations are made available to common education in a timely manner: 17

Beginning in July of the fiscal year in which appropriations
 are made to common education from the Oklahoma Education Lottery
 Trust Fund, the Commission, on or before the ninth day of each
 month, shall transfer to the State Treasurer, for credit to the
 Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund, the amount of net proceeds
 accruing during the preceding month equal to the amount of total

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1 monthly collections due to common education as required by paragraph
2 1 of subsection & F of this section;

2. The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
Services shall allocate the transfers provided for in paragraph 1 of
this subsection to the State Department of Education on a monthly
basis, not to exceed one-twelfth (1/12) of the annual apportionment
for the fiscal year; and

3. The total amount of transfers to the Oklahoma Education
9 Lottery Trust Fund of net lottery proceeds made pursuant to this
10 subsection shall not exceed the total appropriations made to common
11 education from the Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund for the
12 specific fiscal year.

13 I. L. When appropriations from the Oklahoma Education Lottery
14 Trust Fund are made to The Oklahoma State System of Higher
15 Education, the appropriations shall be made available to the System
16 on a monthly basis. In addition to the provisions of subsection B
17 <u>subsections D and E</u> of this section, the following process shall be
18 used to ensure that the appropriations are made available to The
19 Oklahoma State System of Higher Education in a timely manner:

Beginning in July of the fiscal year in which appropriations
 are made to The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education from the
 Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund, the Commission, on or before
 the ninth day of each month, shall transfer to the State Treasurer,
 for credit to the Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund, the amount

1 of net proceeds accruing during the preceding month equal to the 2 amount of total monthly collections due to the Oklahoma State 3 Regents for Higher Education as required by paragraph 2 of 4 subsection  $\in \underline{F}$  of this section;

The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
 Services shall allocate the transfers provided for in paragraph 1 of
 this subsection to the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education
 on a monthly basis, not to exceed one-twelfth (1/12) of the annual
 apportionment for the fiscal year; and

The total amount of transfers to the Oklahoma Education
 Lottery Trust Fund of net lottery proceeds made pursuant to this
 subsection shall not exceed the total appropriations made to The
 Oklahoma State System for Higher Education from the Oklahoma
 Education Lottery Trust Fund for the specific fiscal year.

15 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 713.1 of Title 3A, unless there 17 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The portion of lottery annual net proceeds deposited to the Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund that exceeds Fifty Million Dollars (\$50,000,000.00) shall be appropriated by the Legislature on a cash basis to be allocated by the State Department of Education to public schools based on the audited end-of-year average daily membership in grades PK-12 during the preceding school year for the purpose of implementing prekindergarten-through-third-grade reading
