8	declaring legislative intent to appropriate certain funds; providing for increase in minimum pay band

13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
15	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
16	A. It is the intent of the Oklahoma Legislature that Three
17	Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) be appropriated for the purpose of
18	funding the proposed ten percent (10%) increase of the minimum pay
19	band schedules effective July 1, 2017, as authorized by Section 840-
20	4.6 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
21	SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
22	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
23	A. It is the intent of the Oklahoma Legislature that Twenty-two
24	Million Dollars (\$22,000,000.00) be appropriated for purpose of

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- distributing strategically targeted pay increases to executive
 branch state agencies pursuant to the State Employee Compensation
 Program.
 - B. The provisions of this section shall only apply to the following full-time employees:

- 1. Employees in positions that are compensated at fifteen percent (15%) below comparable market rates of pay, as of July 1, 2017; or
- 2. Employees in positions that have more than a twenty percent (20%) annual voluntary turnover rate.
 - SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

No funds appropriated for the purpose of implementing the pay increase provided in Section 1 and Section 2 of this act shall be expended by any employing public agency, board, commission or other public employing entity in order to increase compensation for persons employed by a private business entity that has entered into a contract with the public employing entity to provide personnel services or temporary services to the public employing entity in order for the public employing entity to perform duties imposed upon it by law or functions which the public employing entity is authorized to perform by law. The provisions of this section shall not be construed to prohibit increases in compensation to a vendor performing other types of services pursuant to a sole source

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    contract or contract awarded pursuant to The Oklahoma Central
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    Purchasing Act.
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        SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2017.
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        SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
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    of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
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    declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
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    be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
