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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:			
17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 5003.10d, is			
18	amended to read as follows:			
19	Section 5003.10d A. The Governor's Council for Workforce and			
20	Economic Development established under the authority of Executive			
21	Order 2005-27 is hereby recognized by the Legislature as the State's			
22	Workforce Investment Board. The Council succeeded and was			
23	established in lieu of the Oklahoma Workforce Investment Board.			
24	Appointed members of the Council serving under the authority of

 continue to serve until their terms have expired and their
 successors have been duly appointed.

4 Pursuant to the federal Workforce Investment Innovation and
5 <u>Opportunity</u> Act, the purpose of the Council shall be to:

Guide the development of a comprehensive and coordinated
workforce development system for the state and monitor its
operation; and

9 2. Review and make recommendations that will align the
10 workforce system, including education, with the economic development
11 goals of the state for the purpose of creating workforce and
12 economic development systems that are integrated and shall provide
13 Oklahoma a competitive advantage in a global economy.

Membership of the Council shall include representatives of 14 Β. 15 private employers who reflect Oklahoma's projected and desired business and industry base and public officials from agencies which 16 provide programs and services related to workforce, education and 17 economic development. All Council members shall be in positions to 18 influence policy and hiring decisions within their organizations. 19 Initial appointments to the Council shall conform to the following 20 described schedule: 21

<u>The membership of the Council shall comply with the federal</u>
 <u>requirements of the state investment board;</u>

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1	2. A majority of the Council shall come from described private
2	sector employers, including: owners of businesses, chief executives
3	or operating officers of businesses, or other business executives or
4	employers with optimum policymaking or hiring authority, and who
5	represent businesses (including small businesses) that provide
6	employment opportunities that at a minimum include high-quality,
7	work-relevant training and development in in-demand industry sectors
8	or occupations in the state;

10	the following named offices, or their successors in office or
11	function:
12	a. Governor,
13	b. two members <u>one member</u> of the Senate, appointed by the
14	President Pro Tempore,
15	c. two members <u>one member</u> of the House of

17	d. Secretary the Executive Director of the Oklahoma
18	Department of Commerce and Tourism, and
19	e. Secretary of Education,
20	f. Secretary of Human Services,

5	3. Two members from organizations with experience in the
6	delivery of workforce services, including community colleges or
7	other community-based workforce service organizations;
8	4. Two members from organizations or individuals that have
9	experience with respect to youth activities;
10	5. Two members that are chief elected officials from a city and
11	county;
12	6. Two members that represent labor organizations; and
13	7. Additional members, at the discretion and pleasure of the
14	Governor, may be appointed representing÷
15	a. local welfare agencies,
16	b. public housing agencies,
17	c. administrators of programs which receive federal or
18	state human resources funding,
19	d. representative of a Local Workforce Board Chairs
20	Association,
21	e. entities with special knowledge and qualifications
22	regarding special educational and career development
23	needs of hard-to-serve individuals,
24	f. state and local economic development representatives,

1	g.	juvenile justice programs,
2	h.	state human resources organization,
3	i.	representatives of tourism, agriculture, corrections
4		and transportation,
5	j.	state organization representing urban-rural hospitals,
6	k.	representatives of Oklahoma Tribes or Nations, and
7	1.	representatives of minorities in Oklahoma the needs or

10	<u>5. Ex of</u>	ficio members, at the discretion and pleasure of the

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C. Private sector members shall be appointed by and serve at 6 the pleasure of the Governor for a two-year term beginning October 7 1, 2005, and may be reappointed. However, of the initial private 8 9 sector members appointed, half shall be appointed for an initial 10 term of one (1) year beginning October 1, 2005. Private members may 11 be removed from office for failure to attend three consecutive 12 Council meetings. The chair of the Council shall be from the private sector and shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure 13 of the Governor. 14

The Council shall meet at such times and places as it deems 15 D. 16 appropriate. Members shall serve without compensation. Council members employed by a state agency shall be reimbursed travel 17 expenses related to their service on the Council as authorized by 18 state law by their respective state agency. Legislative members of 19 the Council shall be reimbursed by their respective houses for 20 necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of their 21 duties as authorized by state law. Remaining Council members shall 22 also be reimbursed travel expenses related to their service on the 23 Council by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce as authorized by 24

 indirectly, from any transaction with the Council.

E. The duties and responsibilities of the Council in the development, monitoring and aligning of the workforce system with economic development shall include, but not be limited to:

6 1. Performing the duties required of the state governance board
7 by the federal Workforce Investment Innovation and Opportunity Act;

8 2. Identifying the human resource investment needs of Oklahoma 9 business and industry, together with those of the citizens of the 10 state, so that each might respond to and meet the needs of the 11 others and thus together build a robust, diversified economy;

3. Reviewing and evaluating workforce development programs within the state, formulate recommendations to increase their efficiency and effectiveness, eliminate duplication, and align with economic goals. Recommendations shall be communicated to the Governor, Legislature, state and federal government agencies and appropriate individuals and entities within the private sector;

Increasing academic capability and technical skills within
 the state workforce and foster lifelong learning among Oklahoma's
 citizens;

5. Strengthening collaboration among institutions which provide
education and training services, government agencies which
coordinate employment and other human resource investment

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1 activities, and Oklahoma business and industry to create a seamless
2 system to nurture healthy economic development; and

6. Enhancing rural economic development capability and
4 capacity, giving particular attention to regional collaboration and
5 partnering.

F. Activities of the Council shall be coordinated by the
Secretary of Commerce and Tourism and directed by the Deputy
Secretary of Commerce for Workforce Development, or their successors
in office or function. Administrative and staffing support for the
Council shall be coordinated by the Office of Workforce Solutions
within the Department of Commerce.

12 G. The State Workforce Solutions Staff Team Partners originally established under the authority of Executive Order 2005-27 as the 13 Workforce Solutions Staff Team is hereby recognized by the 14 Legislature. This interagency team shall be comprised of executive 15 level staff from all workforce, education and economic development 16 agencies of the state for the purpose of providing staff support to 17 the Council and to create efficiencies, eliminate duplication, and 18 eliminate barriers to jointly providing a service delivery system. 19 Other members may be included on this team as the Governor τ 20 Secretary of Commerce or Deputy Secretary of Commerce may deem 21 necessary to accomplish this goal. 22

H. The Council shall be supported by funds available to stateagencies pursuant to state and federal laws and regulations. Each

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1	member of the Council whose agency qualifies pursuant to state and
2	federal law to receive and use such funds shall assist by providing
3	support and funding of the Council in carrying out the
4	responsibilities of the Council.
5	I. The Council shall form a subcommittee on Health Workforce
6	whose purpose shall be to inform, coordinate and facilitate
7	statewide efforts to ensure that a well-trained, adequately
8	distributed and flexible health workforce is available to meet the
9	needs of an efficient and effective health care system in Oklahoma.
10	Duties of the Health Workforce Subcommittee shall include, but not
11	be limited to, the following:
12	1. Conducting data analysis and preparing reports on health
13	workforce supply and demand;
14	2. Research and analysis of state health professional education
15	and training capacity;
16	3. Recommend recruitment and retention strategies for areas
17	determined by the Oklahoma Primary Care Office or the Oklahoma
18	Office of Rural Health to be areas of high need; and
19	4. Assessment of health workforce policy, evaluation of the
20	impact on Oklahoma's health system and health outcomes and
21	developing health workforce policy recommendations.
22	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.
