1	resident of the municipality, he shall thereupon cease to be an
2	elected official of that municipality.
3	B. A municipality with a population of less than one thousand

7	municipality to be an eligible candidate for municipal office.
8	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2013.
