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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3124 of Title 63, unless there
18	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
19	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Brain Death
20	Standards Act".
21	SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
22	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3125 of Title 63, unless there
23	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
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A. The Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision shall
promulgate rules setting forth currently accepted medical standards,
including criteria, tests, and procedures and requiring detailed
documentation of their fulfillment in a patient's medical record
when death is declared pursuant to paragraph 2 of Section 3122 of
Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

7 In assessing currently accepted medical standards, the Board Β. shall consider standards and guidelines issued by the American 8 9 Academy of Neurology and the American Academy of Pediatrics, as well 10 as by other widely recognized medical organizations or sources, and 11 it shall formally consider amending its rules promptly after any 12 changes in such standards or guidelines. The rules promulgated by 13 the Board may incorporate such standards or guidelines, or parts 14 thereof, by reference.

C. The rules shall ensure that if the individual to be declared dead pursuant to Section 3122 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes is or may be an organ donor, the physician who makes the declaration that death has occurred shall not be the organ transplant surgeon, the attending physician of the organ recipient, or an individual otherwise subject to a potentially significant conflict of interest relating to procedures for organ procurement.

D. The rules may provide for testing or completion of
 continuing medical education regarding the required standards
