The provisions of this subsection shall be applicable to any transaction which requires the public trust to lease such tangible personal property to a for-profit business entity from which possession of the tangible personal property was originally acquired and shall be applicable to any transaction pursuant to which the tangible personal property is leased or leased back to any other for-profit business entity.
 - The provisions of this section shall be applicable to tangible personal property as described by this section, the title to which is transferred to any public trust on and after the effective date of this act, but shall not be applicable with respect to such tangible personal property, the title to which was transferred prior to the effective date of this act, or that is subject to other laws or constitutional provisions.
