18	Section 567.5a A. All applicants for a license to practice as				
19	an Advanced Practice Registered Nurse shall be subject to Section				
20	567.8 of this title.				
21	B. An applicant for an initial license to practice as an				
22	Advanced Practice Registered Nurse shall:				
23	1. Submit a completed written application and appropriate fees				
24	as established by the <u>Oklahoma</u> Board <u>of Nursing</u> ;				

Submit a criminal history records check that complies with
 Section 567.18 of this title;

3 3. Hold a current Registered Nurse license in this state; 4 Have completed an advanced practice registered nursing 4. 5 education program in one of the four advanced practice registered nurse roles and a specialty area recognized by the Board. Effective 6 7 January 1, 2016, the applicant shall have completed an accredited graduate level advanced practice registered nursing education 8 9 program in at least one of the following population foci: 10 family/individual across the lifespan, adult-gerontology, neonatal, 11 pediatrics, women's health/gender-related, or psychiatric/mental 12 health;

13 5. Be currently certified in an advanced practice specialty 14 certification consistent with educational preparation and by a 15 national certifying body recognized by the Board; and

16 6. Provide any and all other evidence as required by the Board 17 in its rules.

18 C. The Board may issue a license by endorsement to an Advanced 19 Practice Registered Nurse licensed under the laws of another state 20 if the applicant meets the qualifications for licensure in this 21 state. An applicant by endorsement shall:

Submit a completed written application and appropriate fees
 as established by the Board;

24 2. Hold a current Registered Nurse license in this state;

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3. Hold recognition as an Advanced Practice Registered Nurse in
 a state or territory;

4. Have completed an advanced practice registered nursing 3 4 education program in one of the four roles and a specialty area 5 recognized by the Board. Effective January 1, 2016, the applicant shall have completed an accredited graduate level advanced practice 6 7 registered nursing education program in at least one of the following population foci: family/individual across the lifespan, 8 9 adult-gerontology, neonatal, pediatrics, women's health/gender-10 related, or psychiatric/mental health;

5. Be currently certified in an advanced practice specialty certification consistent with educational preparation and by a national certifying body recognized by the Board;

14 6. Meet continued competency requirements as set forth in Board 15 rules; and

16 7. Provide any and all other evidence as required by the Board 17 in its rules.

D. The Board may issue prescriptive authority recognition by endorsement to an Advanced Practice Registered Nurse licensed as an APRN-CNP, APRN-CNS, or APRN-CNM under the laws of another state if the applicant meets the requirements set forth in this section. An applicant for prescriptive authority recognition by endorsement shall:

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Submit a completed written application and appropriate fees
 as established by the Board;

3 2. Hold current Registered Nurse and Advanced Practice
4 Registered Nurse licenses (APRN-CNP, APRN-CNS, or APRN-CNM) in the
5 this state;

3. Hold current licensure or recognition as an Advanced
Practice Registered Nurse in the same role and specialty with
prescribing privileges in another state or territory;

9 4. Submit documentation verifying successful completion of a
10 graduate level advanced practice registered nursing education
11 program that included an academic course in pharmacotherapeutic
12 management, and didactic and clinical preparation for prescribing
13 incorporated throughout the program;

5. Submit a written statement from an Oklahoma licensed
physician supervising prescriptive authority as required by the
Board in its rules, applicable only during the following:

<u>b.</u> first three (3) years of licensure as an APRN for an

6. Meet continued competency requirements as set forth in Boardrules; and

7. Provide any and all other evidence as required by the Board in its rules. E. An Advanced Practice Registered Nurse license issued under this section shall be renewed concurrently with the registered nurse license provided that qualifying criteria continue to be met. F.
