Page 1, strike the title, enacting clause and entire bill and insert 2 "An Act relating to teachers; requiring certain 3 teachers who take and pass certain examination to be reimbursed certain amount; amending 70 O.S. 2021, 4 Section 6-106.1, which relates to mentor teacher 5 stipends; directing the allocation of funds to school districts for certain purpose; directing a mentor teacher to provide certain support to certain 6 teachers; providing for codification; providing an 7 effective date; and declaring an emergency. 8 9 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 11 SECTION 1. A new section of law to be codified NEW LAW 12 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-101.9 of Title 70, unless 13 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 14 A teacher who is certified pursuant to Section 6-122.3 or 6-187 15 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes and who, at the request of the 16 employing school district, takes and passes a subject area 17 competency examination required by Section 6-187 of Title 70 of the 18 Oklahoma Statutes to earn certification and teach an additional 19 subject in the school district shall be reimbursed by the school 20 district. 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1 Section 6-106.1. If funds are appropriated to the A. The State 2 Board of Education shall allocate funds to school districts for Mentor Teacher Stipends, the. The funds shall be distributed by the 3 4 Board to the school districts to provide a stipend of not more than 5 Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per year for each mentor teacher as 6 defined in Section 6-182 of this title. In addition to the 7 distribution of the five-hundred-dollar stipend, each district shall also receive the district's contribution amount necessary to meet 8 9 the Federal Insurance Contributions Act (F.I.C.A.) requirements. 10 B. A mentor teacher shall provide guidance, support, coaching, 11 and assistance to a teacher in his or her first year of teaching at 12 an employing school district, regardless of the length of time the 13 teacher has been certified. 14 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023. 15 SECTION 4. 21	SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
22	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 8-114 of Title 70, unless there
23	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
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1 A. Except as provided in subsection B of this section, 2 beginning July 1, 2023, the transfer of a student from one school site to another school site within the school district where the 3 4 student resides shall be approved at any time in the year, unless 5 the grade level of the receiving school site has reached capacity. If the capacity of a grade level is insufficient to enroll all 6 7 eligible students, the school district shall select intra-district transfer students based on the preferences outlined in paragraph 1 8 9 of subsection B of this section and then in the order in which the 10 intra-district transfer applications were received. The capacity of 11 a school site shall be determined by the school district board of education based on its policy adopted pursuant to subsection B of 12 13 this section. A student may be granted a one-year intra-district 14 transfer and may automatically continue to attend the school each 15 school year to which the student transferred with the approval of 16 the school district. At the end of each school year, a school 17 district may deny continued intra-district transfer of the student 18 for the reasons outlined in paragraphs 2 and 3 of subsection B of 19 this section. Any sibling of a student who transfers intra-district 20 may attend the school site to which the student transferred, if the 21 school district policy gives preference to sibling transfers 22 regardless of capacity, and the sibling of the transferred student 23 does not meet a basis for denial as outlined in paragraphs 2 and 3 24 of subsection B of this section. Any child in the custody of the

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Department of Human Services in foster care who is living in the home of a student who transfers intra-district, may attend the school site to which the student transferred.

B. Each school district board of education shall adopt a policy
to determine the number of intra-district transfer students the
school district has the capacity to accept in each grade level for
each school site within a school district no later than July 1,
2023. The policy shall be publicly posted on the school district
website. The policy:

10 1. Shall include an enrollment preference and reserve capacity 11 for:

a. students who reside in the school site boundary,
b. students who attended the school site the prior school
year, and

15 c. siblings of students who are already enrolled at the 16 school site;

17 2. May include the acts and reasons outlined in Section 24-18 101.3 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes as a basis for denial of 19 an intra-district transfer; and

3. May include a history of absences as a basis for denial of an intra-district transfer. For the purposes of this section, "history of absences" means ten or more absences in one semester that are not excused for the reasons provided in subsection B of

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1 Section 10-105 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes or due to
2 illness.

C. By the first day of January, April, July, and October of each year, the school district board of education shall establish the number of intra-district transfer students the school district has the capacity to accept in each grade level for each school site within the district.

D. After establishing the number of intra-district transfer
students the school district has the capacity to accept in each
grade level for each school site, the board of education shall:

Publish in a prominent place on the school district website
 the number of intra-district transfer students for each grade level
 for each school site within the school district which the district
 has the capacity to accept; and

15 2. Report to the State Department of Education the number of 16 intra-district transfer students for each grade level for each 17 school site within the school district which the district has the 18 capacity to accept.

SECTION 6. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.
SECTION 7. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
