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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:							
14	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified							
15	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 510.8d of Title 57, unless there							
16	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:							
17	A. The Department of Corrections, in partnership with the							
18	Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services, the							
19	Department of Human Services and the Office of the Governor, is							
20	hereby authorized to establish a post-conviction clemency pilot							
21	program for individuals facing mental health or substance abuse							
22	disorders with the opportunity to receive supportive services when							
23	he or she is selected for the program. Implementing a post-							
24	conviction clemency program that focuses on providing eligible							

individuals with needed services as an alternative to traditional
 incarceration may assist in maintaining public safety and provide
 successful reentry into society. The post-conviction clemency pilot
 program shall be a collaboration between the Department of
 Corrections, Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse
 Services, Department of Human Services and Office of the Governor.

B. The post-conviction clemency pilot program shall provide
individualized services using existing funds and focus on the
following:

10 1. Harm reduction by connecting individuals in need with 11 treatment programs and social services;

12 2. Peer support by using shared experiences to promote and 13 encourage success;

14 3. Intensive outreach by engaging participants in the community 15 to help maintain and improve their level of engagement with 16 services;

Use of professional staff, peer supports and partnerships to
 connect participants with available community services and economic
 supports; and

20 5. Use of evidence-based reentry programs.

C. The purpose of the post-conviction clemency pilot programshall be to:

23 1. Promote positive behavior for reentry of those individuals
24 with behavioral health needs and substance abuse disorders;

1	2.	Address	the	underlying	conditions	that	contribute	to
2	criminal	behavio	or;					

3 3. Increase access to behavioral health support services;
4 4. Improve housing stability through homelessness prevention
5 counseling;

5. Increase access to support services, including employment,
education and enrollment in economic benefit programs; and

8 6. Decrease criminal activity impacting the community.

D. The Department of Corrections, Department of Mental Health
and Substance Abuse Services, Department of Human Services and
Office of the Governor shall promulgate rules necessary to implement
the provisions of this section.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
