10	and procedures in place for protections from carbon monoxide exposure; and providing an effective date.
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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 681, as
15	amended by Section 1, Chapter 55, O.S.L. 2013 (63 O.S. Supp. 2018,
16	Section 681), is amended to read as follows:
17	Section 681. School authorities of the State of Oklahoma, its
18	political subdivisions, and its school districts are authorized to
19	plan, design, and construct new school buildings and make additions
20	to existing school buildings that afford protection for the
21	anticipated school body, faculty, and visitors against tornadoes and
22	severe weather. Each school, administration building and
23	institution of higher learning shall have written plans and
24	procedures in place for protecting students, faculty, administrators

1	and visitors from natural and man-made disasters and emergencies,
2	including, but not limited to threats of carbon monoxide exposure.
3	Plans shall be reviewed and updated annually as appropriate by each
4	school, administration building and institution of higher learning,
5	and placed on file at each school district and each local emergency
6	response organization within the district, which may include police,
7	fire, emergency medical services, sheriff and emergency management
8	of the appropriate jurisdiction. The plans shall be submitted in a
9	format acceptable to the emergency agency no later than November 1
10	of each year. Each school district and institution of higher
11	learning shall make annual reports to the local school board or
12	Board of Regents detailing the status of emergency preparedness and
13	identified safety needs for each school or institution.
14	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
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
