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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1850.8, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 1850.8. A. The Construction Industries Board shall
16	issue a license as a mechanical journeyman or mechanical contractor
17	to any person who:
18	1. Has been certified by the Committee of Mechanical Examiners
19	as having successfully passed the appropriate examination; and
20	2. Has paid the license fee and has otherwise complied with the
21	provisions of the Mechanical Licensing Act. The license fees shall
22	be established by rule by the Board pursuant to Section 1000.5 of
23	this title.
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1	B. A registered apprentice working under the supervision of an
2	active mechanical contractor may sit for the examination for a
3	limited mechanical HVAC license, limited residential journeyman
4	license, limited residential installer license or any subspecialty
5	to the limited mechanical HVAC license without satisfying the
6	training or experience requirements in the Mechanical Licensing Act,
7	provided the overseeing mechanical contractor certifies to the
8	Construction Industries Board that the registered apprentice:
9	1. Has at least eighteen (18) months' substantially similar
10	<pre>experience;</pre>
11	2. Has at least six (6) months' as a registered apprentice
12	under the certifying mechanical contractor; and
13	3. Has the skills necessary to sit for the relevant
14	examination.
15	A journeyman licensed pursuant to this subsection shall be required
16	to work under the supervision of an active mechanical contractor who
17	shall be required to maintain adequate insurance coverage for any
18	journeyman working under their purview. A registered apprentice may
19	not receive an unlimited journeyman license through the provisions
20	of this subsection.
21	<u>C.</u> All licenses shall be nontransferable. No license shall be
22	issued for longer than one (1) year and all licenses shall expire or
23	the last day in the birth month of the licensee. Licenses renewed

more than thirty (30) days following the date of expiration may only

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1 be renewed upon application and payment of the required fees and 2 payment of any penalty for late renewal, as shall be established by 3 the Board. No journeyman or contractor license shall be renewed unless the licensee has completed the required hours of continuing 5 education as determined by the Committee. Persons who are licensed as contractors under the Mechanical Licensing Act may have their 6 7 license placed on inactive status by paying the annual renewal fee and eliminating the bonding and insurance requirements. No late fee 9 shall be charged to renew a license which expired while the 10 applicant was in military service, if application is made within one (1) year of discharge from the military service. 11 12 C. D. The Board is authorized to establish and issue, subject to the provisions of the Mechanical Licensing Act, limited licenses 13 in each area of mechanical work based on the experience, ability, 14 15

examination scores and the education of the applicant. The limited licenses shall authorize the licensee to engage in only those activities and within the limits specified in the license.
