11	mandating establishment of financial need; setting income limitation for financial need; requiring
12	compliance prior to receiving award; and providing an effective date.

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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 2603, as
17	last amended by Section 2, Chapter 289, O.S.L. 2017 (70 O.S. Supp.
18	2018, Section 2603), is amended to read as follows:
19	Section 2603. A. Except as otherwise provided for in
20	subsection B of this section and elsewhere in this section, to be
21	eligible to participate in the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access
22	Program and to qualify for an award which includes payment of an
23	amount equivalent to resident tuition or other tuition pursuant to
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Section 2604 of this title for the first semester or other academic
 unit of postsecondary enrollment, a student shall:

3 1. Be a resident of this state or be enrolled in a school 4 district located in this state that serves students who reside in 5 both this state and an adjacent state pursuant to a contract as 6 authorized in Section 5-117.1 of this title;

7 2. Be a United States citizen or lawfully present in the United States. A student who is not a United States citizen or lawfully 8 9 present in the United States shall not be eligible to participate in 10 the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program and to qualify for an 11 award notwithstanding the provisions of Section 3242 of this title. 12 The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to any student who 13 was enrolled in the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program prior to 14 the end of the 2006-2007 school year;

15 3. Have a record of satisfactory compliance with agreements
16 executed pursuant to Section 2605 of this title;

4. a. have graduated within the previous three (3) years
from a high school accredited by the State Board of
Education, or the Oklahoma School of Science and
Mathematics with a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point
average on a 4.0 scale for all work attempted in
grades nine through twelve,

b. have graduated within the previous three (3) years
from a high school not accredited by the State Board

1 of Education with a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point 2 average on a 4.0 scale for all work attempted in 3 grades nine through twelve and have achieved a 4 composite score of 22 or higher on the ACT test, or 5 с. have satisfactorily completed within the previous three (3) years an educational program that was 6 7 provided through a means other than a public or private school and have achieved a composite score of 8 9 22 or higher on the ACT test;

10 5. Have completed the curricular requirements for admission to 11 an institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education 12 and one additional unit or set of competencies in a course that 13 meets college admission requirements. The curriculum requirements 14 shall include two units or sets of competencies in foreign or non-15 English language or technology courses that meet the college 16 admission requirements and one unit or set of competencies of a fine 17 arts course. Students shall also have attained a 2.5 grade point 18 average in the core curriculum courses. Students who attended a 19 high school which did not offer all the core curriculum courses or 20 students who were educated by other means and were not offered all 21 the core curriculum courses shall be allowed to satisfy this 22 curriculum requirement by participating in a program approved by the 23 State Regents for remediation of high school curricular 24 deficiencies;

B. 1. A student shall be eligible to participate in the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program and to qualify for an award which includes payment of an amount equivalent to resident tuition or other tuition pursuant to Section 2604 of this title for the first semester or other academic unit of postsecondary enrollment if the student meets all of the following criteria:

17a.is a child of any person killed after January 1, 2000,18in the line of duty in any branch of the United States19Armed Forces or who died after January 1, 2000, as a20result of an injury sustained while in the line of21duty in any branch of the United States Armed Forces22and the person who was killed or died filed an23individual or joint Oklahoma income tax return for the

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- 1 tax year prior to the year during which the person was 2 killed or died,
- is a resident of this state or is enrolled in a school 3 b. district located in this state that serves students who reside in both this state and an adjacent state pursuant to a contract as authorized in Section 5-7 117.1 of this title,
- с. enrolls in an institution within The Oklahoma State 8 9 System of Higher Education prior to reaching the age 10 of twenty-one (21),
- has satisfied admission standards as determined by the 11 d. 12 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education for first-13 time-entering students for the appropriate type of 14 institution, or, if attending a private institution, 15 has satisfied admission standards as determined by the 16 private institution. No student participating in the 17 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program shall be 18 admitted into an institution of higher education by 19 special admission standards,
- 20 has secured admission to, and enrolled in, an e. 21 institution which is a member of The Oklahoma State 22 System of Higher Education, a postsecondary 23 vocational-technical program offered by a technology 24 center school that meets the requirements to be

f. executes an agreement pursuant to subsection C of

7 2. A student who is eligible to participate in the program
8 pursuant to this subsection shall not be required to meet the
9 eligibility requirements set forth in subsection A of this section.
10 C. To retain eligibility while pursuing the program of higher
11 learning in which enrolled, the student shall:

Meet the requirements for retention and degree completion as
 established by the institution in which the student is enrolled;

14 2. Maintain good academic standing and satisfactory academic 15 progress according to standards of the Oklahoma State Regents for 16 Higher Education;

Maintain satisfactory academic progress as required for
eligibility for federal Title IV student financial aid programs.
The provisions of this paragraph shall become effective for the
2012-2013 school year;

4. Comply with the standards related to maintenance of
eligibility as promulgated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
Education; and

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5. Refrain from conduct that leads to expulsion or suspension
 of more than one semester from an institution of higher education.
 A student who violates the provisions of this paragraph shall
 permanently lose eligibility for program benefits. The provisions
 of this paragraph shall become effective January 1, 2008.

D. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and the
State Board of Career and Technology Education shall promulgate
rules relating to maintenance of eligibility under the Oklahoma
Higher Learning Access Act by a student.

E. It is the intent of the Legislature that students in the ninth grade for the 1992-93 school year who are determined to be eligible Oklahoma Higher Learning Access students pursuant to the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Act shall be the first students eligible for benefits from the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust Fund.

16 F. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education are 17 authorized to study, develop and propose criteria for determining 18 award eligibility based upon the completion of seven semesters of 19 high school coursework by a student.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.

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
