8	An Act relating to elections; amending 26 O.S. 2021, Section 4-121, as amended by Sections 20, Chapter
9	282, O.S.L. 2022 (26 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 4-121), and 7-103.2, as last amended by Section 6, Chapter
10	293, O.S.L. 2022 (26 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 7- 103.2), which relate to multistate voter list
11	maintenance organizations; modifying authority to join certain organizations; prohibiting license date
12	from non-citizens; providing penalties; authorizing litigation; requiring annual publishing of certain
13	information; prohibiting charging of fee for certain information available to the public; and providing an
14	effective date.
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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2021, Section 4-121, as
19	amended by Section 20, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (26 O.S. Supp. 2022,
20	Section 4-121), is amended to read as follows:
21	Section 4-121 A. The Secretary of the State Election Board may
22	join the State of Oklahoma as a member in one or more multistate
23	voter list maintenance organizations including, but not limited to,
24	the Electronic Registration Information Center (ERIC) or its

successor. The Secretary is authorized to expend funds as available for membership fees, dues and other expenses related to such membership. <u>Prior to the State of Oklahoma joining a multistate</u> <u>voter list maintenance organization, the organization shall certify</u> <u>in writing to the Secretary of the State Election Board that</u> <u>membership in the organization meets the requirements of this</u> section.

B. Upon membership in an organization as provided in subsection 8 9 A of this section, the Secretary of the State Election Board may 10 provide voter registration data to the organization and Service 11 Oklahoma may provide motor vehicle license data to the organization 12 if such data is required to be provided as a condition of 13 membership. The voter registration data and motor vehicle license 14 data described in this subsection may include a person's name, 15 address, date of birth, driver license or state identification 16 number, last four digits of a Social Security number or any other 17 data required by the organization. Service Oklahoma shall not 18 provide motor vehicle license data for persons who are identified as 19 not being citizens of the United States or whose citizenship status 20 is unknown. The transmission and storage of such data shall be done 21 in a secure manner.

C. <u>1.</u> If a multistate voter list maintenance organization of which this state is a member identifies Oklahoma residents who are citizens of the United States eligible to vote but not yet

1 registered, the Secretary of the State Election Board may notify 2 such citizens about the procedure for obtaining a voter registration 3 application and becoming a registered voter in this state. The 4 notification shall not include a voter registration application. 5 The multistate voter list maintenance organization shall 2. 6 certify that, to the best of its knowledge, all persons it 7 identifies as eligible to vote but not yet registered are citizens 8 of the United States. 9 3. The Secretary may delegate the contacting of such citizens 10 to the secretary of the appropriate county election board. 11 If a multistate voter list maintenance organization of which D. 12 this state is a member provides United States Postal Service 13 National Change of Address data regarding registered voters who have 14 changed their address of residence within the state, the Secretary 15 of the State Election Board may use the data pursuant to the 16 provisions of Section 4-118.1, 4-120.2 or 7-115.1 of Title 26 of the 17 Oklahoma Statutes or the federal National Voter Registration Act. 18 E. It shall be unlawful for a multistate voter list maintenance 19 organization of which this state is a member to provide or release 20 any voter registration data or motor vehicle license data received 21 from the State of Oklahoma to any other party. Provided, this shall 22 not prohibit the organization from providing relevant matching 23 information to a member state regarding duplicate registrations, 24 deaths, or changes of residency involving persons identified in the

1	data provided by the State of Oklahoma. Any verified evidence that
2	indicates that any voter registration data or motor vehicle license
3	data for Oklahoma is being used for purposes unrelated to voter roll
4	maintenance or is being used for or is being released to any third
5	party, except as provided in this subsection, shall result in
6	Oklahoma's immediate withdrawal from the multistate voter list
7	maintenance organization. Verified evidence may include Open
8	Records Act documents reviewed during investigation by the
9	Legislature or the Secretary of the State Election Board that
10	indicates that such activity is occurring.
11	F. The Oklahoma Attorney General shall have the authority to
12	pursue litigation in a district court of this state, for damages
13	caused by the unlawful sharing of Oklahoma's data as provided in
14	subsection E of this section against the multistate voter list
15	maintenance organization if the data of the state is shared in
16	violation of this section. Should the Attorney General decline to
17	pursue action, the Secretary of the State Election Board or the
18	Legislature by a majority vote may initiate an action to hire
19	outside counsel to sue the multistate voter list maintenance
20	organization if Oklahoma's data is shared in violation of this
21	section.
22	G. On an annual basis, the Secretary of the State Election
23	Board shall cause to be published on the website of the State
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1	Election Board the following costs associated with membership in a
2	multistate voter list maintenance organization:
3	1. Annual membership dues, if any;
4	2. Mailings sent to persons identified in subsection C of this
5	<pre>section, if any;</pre>
6	3. Information technology utilized for the transfer or receipt
7	of data as described in this section; and
8	4. Any other costs directly attributable to the state's
9	membership in the organization.
10	H. On an annual basis, the Secretary of the State Election
11	Board shall cause to be published on the website of the State
12	Election Board the following statistical information:
13	1. The number of voter registrations by county that are
14	canceled on the basis of information received from the multistate
15	voter list maintenance organization, and the reason for the
16	<pre>cancellation;</pre>
17	2. The number of registered voters by county required to
18	receive an address confirmation mailing on the basis of information
19	received from the multistate voter list maintenance organization;
20	3. The number of mailings by county for persons identified in
21	subsection C of this section; and
22	4. Such other statistical information deemed appropriate by the
23	Secretary of the State Election Board.

 AMENDATORY

Section 7-103.2 <u>A. 1.</u> County election boards shall maintain a
current list of all registered voters in each precinct, which will
reflect the address and party affiliation of each voter. The list
shall be public information; provided, the.

8 <u>2. The</u> list shall only be shared with a court system if that 9 court system agrees to regularly provide the names of persons 10 convicted of a felony in that court system to the Secretary of the 11 State Election Board and the appropriate secretary of a county 12 election board, <u>or if the court system is required by state law to</u> 13 do so.

14 <u>3</u>. The publicly available voter list shall note any voter for 15 whom a first-class mailing from the county election board or the 16 State Election Board was returned undeliverable.

B. The Secretary of the State Election Board shall ensure that
an electronic copy of the voter registration information eligible to
be released publicly pursuant to the Open Records Act is available
to the public free of charge.
SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
