13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2021, Section 4-113, as
15	amended by Section 1, Chapter 293, O.S.L. 2022 (26 O.S. Supp. 2022,
16	Section 4-113), is amended to read as follows:
17	Section 4-113. A. The Secretary of the State Election Board
18	shall devise a voter identification card which shall be issued to
19	every person who becomes a registered voter in Oklahoma. The voter
20	identification card shall contain such information as is necessary
21	to determine a registered voter's eligibility.
22	B. When a person registers to vote or changes his or her
23	registration in any manner to require a new voter identification
24	card, or upon the eighteenth birthday of a person who has submitted

1 a voter registration application pursuant to the provisions of subsection B of Section 4-103 of this title, the county election 2 board secretary in the county of the voter's residence shall 3 transmit the new voter identification card as acknowledgment of the 4 5 transaction which may be the notice required in Section 4-103.1 of this title. New voter identification cards provided for in this 6 subsection shall be mailed to the physical address of the voter if 7 such address is valid to receive mail delivery; provided, however, 8 9 the voter identification card shall be transmitted to the mailing 10 address provided by the voter on his or her voter registration 11 application if the mailing type or physical address meets one of the 12 following exceptions:

1. The voter's physical address of residence is not a valid 13 address to receive mail delivery. A valid address is one that 14 follows the correct standards and formatting of the United States 15 Postal Service. A valid address shall have a street name, street 16 number, city, state, and ZIP code. An invalid address is one that 17 has a directional address or unknown structure under standards of 18 the United States Postal Service or is otherwise not eligible to 19 receive mail delivery from the United States Postal Service. If the 20 applicant's address of residence is not a valid address for mail 21 delivery, the voter identification card shall be transmitted to the 22 mailing address provided by the applicant on his or her voter 23 24 registration application;

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1 D. The Secretary of the State Election Board may promulgate 2 rules to implement the requirements of this section. SECTION 2. 26 O.S. 2021, Section 4-120.1, is 3 AMENDATORY amended to read as follows: 4 5 Section 4-120.1 A. A registered voter may have his or her name removed from the voter registration database by executing a written 6 notice for same to the Secretary of the State Election Board or any 7 county election board. Such written notice shall be personally 8 9 signed by the voter and either shall be notarized or shall be 10 witnessed by two persons whose names and addresses shall be included on the notice. 11 12 B. Any voter who voluntarily cancels his or her voter registration as provided in this section shall be eligible to submit 13 a new voter registration application in the same county when sixty 14 (60) or more calendar days have passed since the submission of the 15 request for cancellation. 16 AMENDATORY SECTION 3. Section 1, Chapter 291, O.S.L. 17 2022 (26 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 6-104.1), is amended to read as 18 follows: 19 Section 6-104.1 A. All ballots used for any election shall be 20 printed on paper to ensure a fair and accurate count; provided, each 21 precinct polling place and in-person absentee voting location shall 22 provide a means for any voter who requires assistance by reason of 23 blindness, disability, or inability to read or write to cast a 24

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ballot privately and independently, in a manner to be determined by
the Secretary of the State Election Board.

3	B. 1. Ballots for each election day precinct shall be printed
4	in advance of the date of the election. Provided, the Secretary of
5	the State Election Board may authorize the printing of additional
6	ballots on election day in the event of a ballot shortage or due to
7	an emergency or unforeseen circumstance as described in Section 22-
8	101 of this title.
9	2. Nothing in this subsection shall prohibit the printing or
10	marking of ballots for persons with blindness, disability, or
11	inability to read or write as provided in subsection A of this
12	section.
13	SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2021, Section 7-104, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 7-104. A. At every Primary, Runoff Primary and General
16	Election and any other election conducted by a county election
17	board, each polling place in the state shall open at 7:00 a.m. and
18	shall remain open continuously until 7:00 p.m., and every registered
19	voter of a precinct who presents himself between said hours shall be
20	entitled to vote, as provided by law, provided further, all
21	qualified voters who are in line waiting to vote at 7:00 p.m. shall
22	be allowed to vote.
23	B. <u>1. A registered voter wishing to vote on election day shall</u>
24	appear at the polling place for his or her assigned precinct.

1	2. Neither the State Election Board nor any county election
2	board shall utilize vote centers for voting on election day. For
3	the purposes of this section "vote center" means a place where any
4	voter in the entire jurisdiction can vote on election day,
5	regardless of the voter's precinct assignment. Provided, an
6	exception to this requirement may be authorized for a county
7	election board by the Secretary of the State Election Board in the
8	event of an emergency as described in Section 22-101 of this title.
9	The emergency use of a countywide vote center must be limited to the
10	precincts directly impacted by the emergency.
11	3. Nothing in this subsection shall prohibit the use of
12	subprecincts as described in Section 3-119 of this title, nor shall
13	it prohibit the assignment of precinct officials to serve more than
14	one precinct, if authorized by law, if the precincts share the same
15	election day polling place.
16	<u>C.</u> If any provision of federal law specifies hours for voting
17	in federal elections, the Secretary of the State Election Board
18	shall direct the county election boards to allow voting in all
19	elections held on the same day as such federal elections during the
20	hours specified by federal law.
21	SECTION 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.
22	SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
23	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
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1	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
