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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
15	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
16	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Whistleblower
17	Liberty Fund Act".
18	SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5001 of Title 62, unless there
20	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
21	No person who provides information regarding alleged misuse of
22	federal funds, whether the funds are provided to a state agency by
23	means of a grant, formula grant, apportionment of federal tax
24	revenue or other federal revenues or by any other means or method,

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shall be disciplined, demoted, transferred, terminated or otherwise penalized as a result of providing information to any person, government entity or organization if the information was provided in the good-faith belief that reasonable grounds existed at the time the information was provided to suspect misuse of the federal funds or that the use of federal funds was in violation of any provisions of the United States Constitution.

8 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 9 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5002 of Title 62, unless there 10 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Any person who provides information regarding the misuse of the federal funds as described in Section 1 of this act shall be awarded a sum equal to ten percent (10%) of the total amount of funds determined, by a court of competent jurisdiction, to have been misused.

SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.

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
