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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-103.6p of Title 70, unless
19	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
20	A. The State Department of Education, in consultation with
21	experts in Native American history and culture, shall develop and
22	make available to public schools curriculum related to Native
23	American history and culture for grade-appropriate instruction of

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students in grades six through twelve.

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- B. Beginning in the 2023-2024 school year, Native American history and culture shall be taught to students in grades six through twelve in public schools in this state, as prescribed in the Oklahoma Academic Standards. Native American history and culture may be integrated into one or more existing courses of study and shall be taught in a manner that:
- Generates an understanding of the experiences and 1. contributions of Native Americans to American history and culture;
- 2. Develops dialogue with students on the ramifications of bullying, bigotry, stereotyping, and discrimination; and
- 3. Encourages tolerance of diversity and reverence for human dignity for all citizens in a pluralistic society.
- The State Department of Education, in consultation with experts in Native American history and culture, shall develop and implement high quality professional learning opportunities for teachers covering Native American history and culture.
 - SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.
- SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
