7	An Act relating to waters and water rights; directing the Oklahoma Water Resources Board to not take action
8	which would affect certain permits used pursuant to the Federal Clean Water Act; prohibiting certain
9	state agencies from promulgating rules that extend the definition of the waters of the state; amending
10	82 O.S. 2011, Sections 1020.4 and 1020.5, which relate to groundwater; prohibiting the Oklahoma Water
11	Resources Board from making certain evaluations when conducting hydrologic surveys and investigations;
12	prohibiting the Board from considering certain interactions when determining maximum annual yields;
13	providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1085.30b of Title 82, unless
19	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
20	A. The Oklahoma Water Resources Board shall not take any action
21	under its authority to adopt standards of quality of the waters of
22	the state and to classify such waters which would abrogate to any
23	extent the right or privilege of anyone to obtain and act in
24	accordance with the provisions of a permit issued or that may be

issued by the United States Army Corps of Engineers pursuant to
 Section 404 of the Federal Clean Water Act for the discharge of
 dredged or fill material into waters of the United States or
 navigable waters as defined by federal law or waters of the state as
 defined in Section 1-1-201 of Title 27A of the Oklahoma Statutes.

B. The Oklahoma Water Resources Board, the Department of
Environmental Quality or any other state agency, board or commission
shall not promulgate any rule that for any purpose extends, or that
by effect would extend, the definition of the waters of the state
beyond that provided for in Section 1-1-201 of Title 27A of the
Oklahoma Statutes.

12 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 82 O.S. 2011, Section 1020.4, is 13 amended to read as follows:

Section 1020.4 A. Prior to making orders establishing the tentative maximum annual yield for major groundwater basins or subbasins therein, the Oklahoma Water Resources Board shall make hydrologic surveys and investigations.

B. Prior to making orders establishing the tentative maximum annual yield for minor groundwater basins or subbasins therein, the Board shall prepare reports using information from hydrologic surveys and investigations of groundwater basins or subbasins having substantially the same geological and hydrological characteristics and data from wells in such basin or subbasins and other relevant information.

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C. The Board is authorized to cooperate with state and federal
 agencies engaged in similar surveys and investigations and may
 accept and use the findings of such agencies. At least every twenty
 (20) years after issuance of the final order determining the maximum
 annual yield, the Board shall review and update if necessary the
 hydrologic surveys.

D. The Board shall not evaluate interactions with surface
 waters when conducting either major or minor groundwater basin or
 subbasin hydrologic surveys and investigations.

10SECTION 3.AMENDATORY82 O.S. 2011, Section 1020.5, is11amended to read as follows:

Section 1020.5 A. After completing the hydrologic survey, the Board shall make a tentative determination of the maximum annual yield of groundwater to be produced from each ground water basin or subbasin therein. Such determination must be based upon the following:

The total land area overlying the basin or subbasin;
 The amount of water in storage in the basin or subbasin;
 The rate of recharge to the basin or subbasin and total
 discharge from the basin or subbasin;

4. Transmissibility of the basin or subbasin; and

5. The possibility of pollution of the basin or subbasin fromnatural sources.

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B. The maximum annual yield of each major ground water basin or
 subbasin shall be based upon a minimum basin or subbasin life of
 twenty (20) years from the effective date of the order establishing
 the final determination of the maximum annual yield.

5 C. For minor groundwater basins or subbasins therein, the 6 tentative determination of the maximum annual yield shall be based 7 upon present and reasonably foreseeable future use of groundwater 8 from such basin or subbasin, recharge and total discharge, the 9 geographical region in which the basin or subbasin is located and 10 other relevant factors.

11 <u>D. The Board shall not consider interactions with surface</u> 12 <u>waters when determining the maximum annual yield for either major or</u> 13 minor groundwater basins or subbasins.

14 SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 15 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby 16 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and 17 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
