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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6100 of Title 59, unless there
18	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
19	A. No person shall be disqualified from pursuing, practicing or
20	engaging in any occupation for which a license is required solely or
21	in part because of a prior conviction, unless it is a conviction
22	directly related to the occupation for which the license is sought.
23	Nothing in this section shall apply to a constitutional or statutory
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- 1 provision explicitly stating that certain convictions are automatic 2 bars to licensing.
 - B. In determining if a conviction directly relates to the position or the occupation for which the license is sought, the licensing authority shall consider:
 - 1. Whether the conviction is directly related to the duties and responsibilities of the occupation;
 - 2. Whether the occupation offers the opportunity for the same or a similar offense to occur; and
 - 3. The length of time since the offense occurred.
 - C. If a licensing authority intends to deny a license or disqualify an applicant from pursuing, practicing or engaging in any occupation for which a license is required solely or in part because of the applicant's prior conviction of a crime, the licensing authority shall notify the applicant in writing of the following, prior to a final decision regarding the license:
 - 1. Identify the conviction items that are the basis for the potential denial or disqualification;
 - 2. Provide a copy of the conviction history report, if any; and
 - 3. Provide examples of mitigation or rehabilitation evidence that the applicant may voluntarily provide.
- D. The applicant who has been convicted of an offense which directly relates to the occupation for which a license is sought shall not be disqualified from pursuing, practicing or engaging in

- the occupation if the applicant can provide evidence of mitigation or rehabilitation and present fitness to perform the duties of the occupation for which the license is sought.
 - E. The applicant shall have thirty (30) business days after issuance of the notice provided in subsection C of this section to respond with any information, including challenging the accuracy of the information and submitting mitigation or rehabilitation evidence.
 - F. Evidence of mitigation or rehabilitation of the applicant may be established by:
 - 1. Showing that at least one (1) year has elapsed since release from any correctional institution without subsequent conviction of a crime and showing evidence of compliance with terms and conditions of probation or parole; or
 - 2. Providing any other evidence of mitigation or rehabilitation and present fitness, including, but not limited to, letters of reference.
 - G. If a licensing authority denies a license or disqualifies the applicant from pursuing, practicing or engaging in any occupation for which a license is required solely or in part because of the applicant's prior conviction of a crime, the licensing authority shall notify the applicant in writing of the following:
 - 1. The final denial or disqualification;
 - 2. The appeal process; and

1	3. The earliest date the applicant may reapply for the license.
2	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
