L3	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified

L 9	1. "Internal combustion engine" shall mean an engine of one or
20	more working cylinders in which the process of combustion takes

22	2. "Motor vehicle" shall have the same meaning as defined in
23	Section 1-134 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

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1	C. No city, town, county, or subdivision thereof shall adopt an
2	ordinance, rule, or code which limits the sale, purchase, trade, or
3	usage of any motor vehicle which utilizes an internal combustion
4	engine as means of propulsion.
5	D. For the purposes of promoting commerce and the equitable
6	treatment of the citizens of this state, limitations on the sale,
7	purchase, trade, or usage of any motor vehicle which utilizes an
8	internal combustion engine as a means of propulsion by any city,
9	town, county, or subdivision thereof is declared to be a statewide
10	concern and shall be prohibited pursuant to subsection C of this
11	act.
12	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
