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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1210.508-4 of Title 70, unless
18	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
19	A. As used in this section, "Individual Career and Academic
20	Plan (ICAP)" means an individualized plan developed by the student
21	and the student's parent or legal guardian, in collaboration with
22	their school counselors, school administrators, teachers and other
23	school personnel, that is used to help establish personalized
24	academic and career goals, explore postsecondary career and

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1 educational opportunities, align coursework and curriculum, apply to 2 postsecondary institutions, secure financial aid and ultimately 3 enter the workforce.

4 As part of the multimeasures approach to high school Β. 5 graduation recommended by the State Board of Education, pursuant to Section 5 of House Bill No. 3218 passed by the Legislature in the 6 7 2nd Session of the 55th Legislature, the Board shall adopt a new statewide system of college and career planning tools which shall be 8 9 known as the "Individual Career Academic Plan (ICAP)". The Board 10 shall work cooperatively with school districts to incorporate the 11 ICAP into graduation requirements.

Beginning with students entering the ninth grade in the
 2019-2020 school year, each student shall be required to complete
 the process of an ICAP in order to graduate from a public high
 school with a standard diploma. Each year thereafter, students
 shall annually update their ICAP. The ICAP shall include, but not
 be limited to:

18 a. career- and college-interest surveys,

b. written postsecondary and workforce goals and
information of progress towards these goals,

- c. intentional sequence of courses that reflect progress
 toward the postsecondary goal,
- 23 d. the student's academic progress, including courses
 24 taken, assessment scores, any remediation or credit

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1 recovery and any Advanced Placement, International 2 Baccalaureate; concurrent or dual enrollment credits 3 earned and/or career certificate(s), certification(s), 4 or endorsements, and 5 e. experience in-service learning and/or work environment

7 2. The ICAP system shall be implemented according to the8 following schedule:

- 9 a. for the 2017-2018 school year, the Oklahoma State

 11 districts, the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher

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1	C. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent a
2	district from implementing the ICAP for students in earlier grades.
3	D. ICAPs for students with disabilities, as defined in the
4	Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), P.L. No. 105-17,
5	shall take into account and work in cooperation with the student's
6	individualized education program (IEP) or Section 504 Plan as
7	defined by the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, P.L. No. 93-112.
8	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
