Supp. 2022, 16 Section 1176), is amended to read as follows: 17 Section 1176. A. Whoever, with the intent to threaten, 18 intimidate or harass, or facilitate another to threaten, intimidate 19 or harass, uses an electronic communication device to knowingly 20 publish, post or otherwise make publicly available personally 21 identifiable information of a peace officer, public official, 22 medical care provider, or crime victim, and as a result places that 23 peace officer, public official, medical care provider, or crime

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victim in reasonable fear of death or serious bodily injury shall,

- 1 upon conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by
- 2 | imprisonment in the county jail for a term not to exceed six (6)
- 3 | months, or by a fine not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00),
- 4 or by both such fine and imprisonment. Upon conviction for a second
- 5 or subsequent violation, the person shall be punished by
- 6 imprisonment in the county jail for a term not to exceed one (1)
- 7 | year, or by a fine not to exceed Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00),
- 8 or by both such fine and imprisonment.
- 9 B. To the extent the provisions of Section A apply to medical
- 10 | care providers, the protections provided herein shall not apply when
- 11 | the incident is unrelated to the provider's professional duties.
- 12 C. As used in this section:
- 13 1. "Crime victim" shall have the same meaning as that term is
- 14 defined in Section 142A-1 of this title;
- 15 | 2. "Electronic communication" shall have the same meaning as
- 16 that term is defined in Section 1172 of this title. Electronic
- 17 | communication does not include broadcast transmissions or similar
- 18 | communications that are not targeted at any specific individual;
- 19 3. "Electronic communication device" means any cellular
- 20 telephone, facsimile, pager, computer or any device capable of
- 21 | electronic communication;
- 4. "Medical care provider" means a doctor, resident, intern,
- 23 | nurse, nurse practitioner, nurses' aide, ambulance attendant or
- 24 operator, paramedic, emergency medical technician, laboratory

2	assistant, chaplain of a health care facility, volunteer of a health
3	care facility, pharmacist, nursing student, medical student, member
4	of a hospital security force, and any other employee or contractor

6	5. "Peace officer" shall have the same meaning as that term is
7	defined in Section 99 of this title;

9	which can identify an individual including, but not limited to,
10	name, birth date, place of birth, mother's maiden name, biometric
11	records, Social Security number, official state- or government-
12	issued driver license or identification number, government passport
13	number, employer or taxpayer identification number or any other
14	information that is linked or linkable to an individual, such as
15	medical, educational, financial or employment information;
16	6. 7. "Public official" means any person elected or appointed
17	to a state office in the executive, legislative or judicial branch
18	of state government or other political subdivision of the state; and
19	7. 8. "Publish" means to circulate, deliver, distribute,
20	disseminate, transmit or otherwise make available to another person.
