15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1176, as
16	amended by Section 4, Chapter 318, O.S.L. 2022 (21 O.S. Supp. 2022,
17	Section 1176), is amended to read as follows:
18	Section 1176. A. Whoever, with the intent to threaten,
19	intimidate or harass, or facilitate another to threaten, intimidate
20	or harass, uses an electronic communication device to knowingly
21	publish, post or otherwise make publicly available personally
22	identifiable information of a peace officer, public official,
23	medical care provider, or crime victim, and as a result places that
24	peace officer, public official, <u>medical care provider,</u> or crime

Upon conviction for a second or subsequent violation, the person shall be punished by 6 imprisonment in the county jail for a term not to exceed one (1) 7 year, or by a fine not to exceed Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00), 8 9 or by both such fine and imprisonment.
