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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1176, as
14	amended by Section 4, Chapter 318, O.S.L. 2022 (21 O.S. Supp. 2022,
15	Section 1176), is amended to read as follows:
16	Section 1176. A. Whoever, with the intent to threaten,
17	intimidate or harass, or facilitate another to threaten, intimidate
18	or harass, uses an electronic communication device to knowingly
19	publish, post or otherwise make publicly available personally
20	identifiable information of a peace officer, public official,
21	medical care provider, or crime victim, and as a result places that
22	peace officer, public official, <u>medical care provider</u> , or crime
23	victim in reasonable fear of death or serious bodily injury shall,
24	upon conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by

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imprisonment in the county jail for a term not to exceed six (6) months, or by a fine not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment. Upon conviction for a second or subsequent violation, the person shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail for a term not to exceed one (1) year, or by a fine not to exceed Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment.

B. To the extent the provisions of Section A apply to medical
 g care providers, the protections provided herein shall not apply when
 the incident is unrelated to the provider's professional duties.

11 <u>C.</u> As used in this section:

12 1. "Crime victim" shall have the same meaning as that term is
 13 defined in Section 142A-1 of this title;

14 2. "Electronic communication" shall have the same meaning as 15 that term is defined in Section 1172 of this title. Electronic 16 communication does not include broadcast transmissions or similar 17 communications that are not targeted at any specific individual;

18 3. "Electronic communication device" means any cellular 19 telephone, facsimile, pager, computer or any device capable of 20 electronic communication;

4. <u>"Medical care provider" means a doctor, resident, intern,</u>
nurse, nurse practitioner, nurses' aide, ambulance attendant or
operator, paramedic, emergency medical technician, laboratory
technician, radiologic technologist, physical therapist, physician

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1 <u>assistant, chaplain of a health care facility, volunteer of a health</u> 2 <u>care facility, pharmacist, nursing student, medical student, member</u> 3 <u>of a hospital security force, and any other employee or contractor</u> 4 <u>working in or for a health care facility;</u>

5 <u>5.</u> "Peace officer" shall have the same meaning as that term is
6 defined in Section 99 of this title;

7 5. 6. "Personally identifiable information" means information which can identify an individual including, but not limited to, 8 9 name, birth date, place of birth, mother's maiden name, biometric records, Social Security number, official state- or government-10 11 issued driver license or identification number, government passport 12 number, employer or taxpayer identification number or any other 13 information that is linked or linkable to an individual, such as 14 medical, educational, financial or employment information;

15 <u>6.</u> <u>7.</u> "Public official" means any person elected or appointed 16 to a state office in the executive, legislative or judicial branch 17 of state government or other political subdivision of the state; and

18 7. 8. "Publish" means to circulate, deliver, distribute,
19 disseminate, transmit or otherwise make available to another person.
20 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
