Students shall also have attained a 2.5 grade point 18 average in the core curriculum courses. Students who attended a 19 high school which did not offer all the core curriculum courses or 20 students who were educated by other means and were not offered all 21 the core curriculum courses shall be allowed to satisfy this 22 curriculum requirement by participating in a program approved by the 23 State Regents for remediation of high school curricular

24 deficiencies;

Have secured admission to, and enrolled in, an institution 8 9 which is a member of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, 10 a postsecondary vocational-technical program offered pursuant to a 11 duly approved cooperative agreement between a technology center 12 school and an institution of The Oklahoma State System of Higher 13 Education, or a private institution of higher learning located 14 within this state and accredited pursuant to Section 4103 of this 15 title; and 16 8. have established financial need according to the a. 17 provisions of subsection D of Section 2605 of this

A student shall be eligible to participate in the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program and to qualify for an award which includes payment of an amount equivalent to resident tuition or other tuition pursuant to Section 2604 of this title for the first semester or other academic unit of postsecondary enrollment if the student meets all of the following criteria:

a. is a child of any person killed after January 1, 2000,
in the line of duty in any branch of the United States

Armed Forces or who died after January 1, 2000, as a result of an injury sustained while in the line of duty in any branch of the United States Armed Forces and the person who was killed or died filed an individual or joint Oklahoma income tax return for the tax year prior to the year during which the person was killed or died,

E. It is the intent of the Legislature that students in the ninth grade for the 1992-93 school year who are determined to be eligible Oklahoma Higher Learning Access students pursuant to the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Act shall be the first students eligible for benefits from the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust Fund.

F. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education are authorized to study, develop and propose criteria for determining award eligibility based upon the completion of seven (7) semesters of high school coursework by a student.

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SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 2605, as
 amended by Section 26, Chapter 11, O.S.L. 2012 (70 O.S. Supp. 2014,
 Section 2605), is amended to read as follows:

4 Section 2605. A. Each school year, every fifth- through 5 ninth-grade eleventh-grade student in the public and private schools of this state and students who are educated by other means and are 6 7 in the equivalent of the fifth through ninth eleventh grade shall be apprised, together with the parent, custodial parent, or guardian of 8 9 the student, of the opportunity for access to higher learning under 10 the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program. The Oklahoma State 11 Regents for Higher Education and the State Board of Education shall 12 develop, promote, and coordinate a public awareness program to be 13 utilized in making students and parents aware of the Oklahoma Higher 14 Learning Access Program.

15 B. On a form provided by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 16 Education, every public school district shall designate at least one 17 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program contact person, who shall be 18 a counselor or teacher, at each public school site in this state in 19 which eighth-, ninth- or tenth-grade, tenth- or eleventh-grade 20 classes are taught. When requested by the State Regents, the State 21 Board of Education shall assist the State Regents to ensure the 22 designation of contact persons. Private schools shall also 23 designate at least one school official as a contact person. For 24 students who are educated by other means, a parent or guardian or

1 other person approved by the State Regents shall be designated the 2 contact person.

3 C. 1. Students who qualify on the basis of financial need according to subsection D or E of this section or who meet the 4 5 eligibility qualification set forth in subparagraph a of paragraph 1 of subsection B of Section 2603 of this title prior to entering the 6 7 tenth twelfth grade or prior to reaching the age of fifteen (15) eighteen (18) and the standards and provisions promulgated by the 8 9 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall be given the 10 opportunity throughout the eighth-, ninth-, and tenth-grade tenth-11 and eleventh-grade years, for students enrolled in a public or 12 private school, or between the ages of thirteen (13) and fifteen 13 (15) eighteen (18), for students who are educated by other means, to 14 enter into participation in the program by agreeing to, throughout 15 the remainder of their school years or educational program:

16 17 a. attend school or an educational program regularly and do homework regularly,

18 b. refrain from substance abuse,

19 c. refrain from commission of crimes or delinquent acts,

20d.have school work and school records reviewed by21mentors designated pursuant to the program,

e. provide information requested by the Oklahoma State

f. participate in program activities.

2 Students who meet the eligibility qualification set forth in 2. 3 subparagraph a of paragraph 1 of subsection B of Section 2603 of 4 this title after completing the tenth eleventh grade or after 5 reaching the age of sixteen (16) shall be given the opportunity prior to reaching the age of twenty-one (21) to enter into 6 7 participation in the program and shall execute an agreement with provisions as determined by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 8 9 Education.

10 3. The contact person shall maintain the agreements, which shall be executed on forms provided by the Oklahoma State Regents 11 12 for Higher Education and managed according to regulations 13 promulgated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, and 14 the contact person shall monitor compliance of the student with the 15 terms of the agreement. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 16 Education are authorized to process student agreements and verify 17 compliance with the agreements. Students failing to comply with the 18 terms of the agreement shall not be eligible for the awards provided 19 in Section 2604 of this title.

D. Except as otherwise provided for in subsection E of this section and except for students who qualify pursuant to subsection B of Section 2603 of this title, a student shall not be found to be in financial need for purposes of the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program if: 1 1. At the time the student applies for participation in the 2 Program during the eighth, ninth or, tenth <u>or eleventh</u> grade for 3 students enrolled in a public or private school, or between the ages 4 of thirteen (13) and fifteen (15) <u>eighteen (18)</u>, for students who 5 are educated by other means, the income from taxable and nontaxable 6 sources of the student's parent(s) exceeds Fifty Thousand Dollars 7 (\$50,000.00) per year; and

8 2. At the time the student begins postsecondary education and
9 prior to receiving any Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program
10 benefit award, the federal adjusted gross income of the student's
11 parent(s) exceeds One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) per
12 year.

13 The determination of financial qualification as set forth in 14 this paragraph shall be based on the income of the student, not the 15 income of the parent(s), if a student:

16 is determined to be independent of the student's a. 17 parents for federal financial aid purposes, 18 b. was in the permanent custody of the Department of 19 Human Services at the time the student enrolled in the 20 program, or 21 с. was in the court-ordered custody of a federally 22 recognized Indian tribe, as defined by the federal 23 Indian Child Welfare Act, at the time the student 24 enrolled in the program.

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The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to any student
 who has received an Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit
 award prior to the 2012-2013 school year.

4 A student who was adopted between birth and twelve (12) E. 1. 5 years of age while in the permanent custody of the Department of Human Services, in the court-ordered custody of a licensed private 6 7 nonprofit child-placing agency, or federally recognized Indian tribe, as defined by the federal Indian Child Welfare Act, shall not 8 9 be found to be in financial need for purposes of the Oklahoma Higher 10 Learning Access Program if at the time the student begins 11 postsecondary education and prior to receiving any Oklahoma Higher 12 Learning Access Program benefit award, the federal adjusted gross 13 income of the student's parent(s) exceeds One Hundred Fifty Thousand 14 Dollars (\$150,000.00) per year. The provisions of this paragraph 15 shall not apply to any student who has received an Oklahoma Higher 16 Learning Access Program benefit award prior to the 2012-2013 school 17 year.

18 2. A student who was adopted between thirteen (13) and 19 seventeen (17) years of age while in the permanent custody of the 20 Department of Human Services, in the court-ordered custody of a 21 licensed private nonprofit child-placing agency, or federally 22 recognized Indian tribe, as defined by the federal Indian Child 23 Welfare Act, shall not be found to be in financial need for purposes 24 of the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program if at the time the

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student begins postsecondary education and prior to receiving any Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award, the federal adjusted gross income of the student's parent(s) exceeds Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) per year. The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to any student who has received an Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award prior to the 2012-2013 school year.

3. Except for students who qualify pursuant to subsection B of 8 9 Section 2603 of this title, the determination of financial 10 qualification as set forth in this subsection shall be based on the 11 income of the student, not the income of the parent(s), if the 12 student is determined to be independent of the student's parents for 13 federal financial aid purposes. A determination of financial 14 qualification shall not be required for the student who meets the 15 criteria set forth in this subsection at the time the student 16 applies for participation in the program. The provisions of this 17 paragraph shall not apply to any student who has received an 18 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award prior to the 19 2008-2009 school year.

F. The financial qualification of a student as set forth in subsections D and E of this section shall be certified by the contact person or by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education on the agreement form provided by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education. The form shall be retained in the permanent

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record of the student and a copy forwarded to the Oklahoma State
 Regents for Higher Education.

G. Agreements shall be witnessed by the parent, custodial
parent, or guardian of the student, who shall further agree to:
1. Assist the student in achieving compliance with the
agreements;

7 2. Confer, when requested to do so, with the school contact8 person, other school personnel, and program mentors;

9 3. Provide information requested by the Oklahoma State Regents10 for Higher Education or the State Board of Education; and

4. Assist the student in completing forms and reports required for program participation, making applications to institutions and schools of higher learning, and filing applications for student grants and scholarships.

15 Students who are enrolled in a school district located in н. 16 this state that serves students who reside in both this state and an 17 adjacent state pursuant to a contract as authorized in Section 5-18 117.1 of this title, are in the eleventh and twelfth grades during 19 the 2006-2007 school year, and who were denied participation in the 20 program shall be allowed to enter or reenter into participation in 21 the program by entering into agreements as set forth in subsections 22 C and D of this section by June 1, 2008.

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I. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall
 promulgate rules for the determination of student compliance with
 agreements made pursuant to this section.

J. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall designate personnel to coordinate tracking of program records for the years when students participating in the program are still in the schools or are being educated by other means, provide staff development for contact persons in the schools, and provide liaison with the State Board of Education and local organizations and individuals participating in the program.

K. The school district where an Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program student is enrolled when the student begins participation in the program and any subsequent school district where the student enrolls shall forward information regarding participation by the student in the program to a school to which the student transfers upon the request of the school for the records of the student.

17 L. Students participating in the Oklahoma Higher Learning 18 Access Program shall provide their social security number or their 19 student identification number used by their school to the Oklahoma 20 State Regents for Higher Education. The Regents shall keep the 21 numbers confidential and use them only for administrative purposes. 22 SECTION 6. This act shall become effective July 1, 2015. 23 SECTION 7. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 24 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby

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1	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
