8	An Act relating to state government; amending Section 1, Chapter 63, O.S.L. 2016 (74 O.S. Supp. 2016,
9	Section 4110.1), which relates to the Bill of Rights Monument Display Act; modifying short title;
10	authorizing the State Capitol Preservation Commission to permit placement of certain monument on the State
11	Capitol grounds; providing for design, construction, payment and placement of monument; and providing an
12	effective date.

15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 63, O.S.L. 2016
17	(74 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 4110.1), is amended to read as follows:
18	Section 4110.1 A. This section shall be known and may be cited
19	as the "Bill of Rights and Other Important Amendments Monument
20	Display Act".
21	B. The State Capitol Preservation Commission or designee is
22	hereby authorized to permit and arrange for the placement on the
23	State Capitol grounds of a suitable monument displaying the first
24	ten amendments to the Constitution of the United States, commonly

referred to as the Bill of Rights. This monument shall be designed, constructed, and placed on the State Capitol grounds by private entities at no expense to the state. The State Capitol Preservation Commission or designee is authorized to assist private entities in selecting a location for the monument and arranging a suitable time for its placement.

7 C. In addition to the Bill of Rights monument described in subsection B of this section, the State Capitol Preservation 8 9 Commission or designee is hereby authorized to permit and arrange 10 for the placement of a suitable monument on the State Capitol 11 grounds displaying the 13th, 14th and 15th amendments to the 12 Constitution of the United States. This monument shall be designed, 13 constructed and placed next to the Bill of Rights monument on the 14 State Capitol grounds by private entities at no expense to the 15 state. The State Capitol Preservation Commission or designee is 16 authorized to assist private entities in selecting a location for 17 the monument and arranging a suitable time for its placement. 18 SECTION 2.
