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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 142, Chapter 366, O.S.L.
19	2016, as last amended by Section 20, Chapter 161, O.S.L. 2020 (37A
20	O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 6-102), is amended to read as follows:
21	Section 6-102. A. No licensee of the ABLE Commission shall:
22	1. Receive, possess or sell any alcoholic beverage except as
23	authorized by the Oklahoma Alcoholic Beverage Control Act and by the
24	license or permit which the licensee holds;

a mixed beverage, beer and wine, caterer, public 4 a. 5 event, special event, bottle club, retail wine or retail beer licensee may employ servers or sales 6 7 clerks who are at least eighteen (18) years of age, except persons under twenty-one (21) years of age may 8 9 not serve in designated bar or lounge areas, and b. a mixed beverage, beer and wine, caterer, public 10 11 event, special event or bottle club licensee may 12 employ or hire musical bands who have musicians who are under eighteen (18) years of age if each such 13 musician is either accompanied by a parent or legal 14 15 quardian or has on their person, to be made available for inspection upon demand by any employee of the ABLE 16 Commission or law enforcement officer, a written, 17 notarized affidavit from the parent or legal guardian 18 giving the underage musician permission to perform in 19 designated bar or lounge areas; 20

3. Give any alcoholic beverage as a prize, premium or consideration for any lottery, game of chance or skill or any type of competition;

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4. Use any of the following means or inducements to stimulate
 the consumption of alcoholic beverages, including but not limited
 to:

deliver more than two drinks to one person at one 4 a. 5 time, except as provided for serving tasting flights defined in Section 2 6-102.1 of this act title, 6 7 b. sell or offer to sell to any person or group of persons any drinks at a price that is less than six 8 9 percent (6%) below the markup of the cost to the mixed 10 beverage licensee; provided, a mixed beverage licensee 11 shall be permitted to offer these drink specials on 12 any particular hour of any particular day and shall not be required to offer these drink specials for an 13 entire calendar week or from open to close, and shall 14 15 not be required to offer such drink specials at all 16 venues operating under the same mixed beverage license, 17

- c. sell or offer to sell to any person an unlimited
 number of drinks during any set period of time for a
 fixed price, except at private functions not open to
 the public,
- d. sell or offer to sell drinks to any person or group of
 persons on any one day or portion thereof at prices
 less than those charged the general public on that

- 1 day, except at private functions not open to the
 2 public,
- e. increase the volume of alcoholic beverages contained
 in a drink without increasing proportionately the
 price regularly charged for such drink during the same
 calendar week, or
- f. encourage or permit, on the licensed premises, any
 game or contest which involves drinking or the
 awarding of drinks as prizes.

Provided, that the provisions of this paragraph shall not prohibit the advertising or offering of food or entertainment in licensed establishments;

5. Permit or allow any patron or person to exit the licensed 13 premises with an open container of any alcoholic beverage. 14 15 Provided, this prohibition shall not be applicable to closed original containers of alcoholic beverages which are carried from 16 the licensed premises of a bottle club by a patron, closed original 17 wine containers removed from the premises of restaurants, hotels and 18 motels, or to closed original containers of alcoholic beverages 19 transported to and from the place of business of a licensed caterer 20 by the caterer or an employee of the caterer; 21

6. Serve or sell alcoholic beverages with an expired licenseissued by the ABLE Commission; or

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7. Permit any person to be drunk or intoxicated on the
 2 licensee's licensed premises.

B. A mixed beverage or beer and wine licensee shall not be
deemed to have violated the provisions of paragraph 5 of subsection
A of this section if it allowed a patron to leave the licensed
premises with an open container of beer or wine only and:

7 1. The otherwise prohibited act was committed during the hours
8 of 8 a.m. to midnight on the day of a scheduled home football game
9 of institutions within The Oklahoma State System of Higher
10 Education, and the establishment is located within two thousand
11 (2,000) feet of the institution;

2. The licensee is participating by invitation in a municipally sanctioned art, music or sporting event within city limits when the municipality has provided written notice of the event and a list of invited licensees to the ABLE Commission at least five (5) days prior to the event; or

3. The patron remains on the connected, physical property of the licensee or in a public area adjacent to the physical property of the licensee with prior municipal approval; provided that written notice of the use of the connected, physical property of the licensee or public area shall be provided to the ABLE Commission at least five (5) days prior to such use.
