10	An Act relating to teacher certification; amending 70
11	O.S. 2011, Section 6-187, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 139, O.S.L. 2020 (70 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section (187), which values to compatency.
12	Section 6-187), which relates to competency examinations for teacher certification; allowing the State Deard of Education to grant exceptions to the
13	State Board of Education to grant exceptions to the certification examinations for certain teacher
14	candidates who are deaf; providing definition; providing criteria for exceptions; providing for
15	promulgation of rules; providing for applicable teaching environments; providing an effective date;
16	and declaring an emergency.
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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
19	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 6-187, as
20	last amended by Section 1, Chapter 139, O.S.L. 2020 (70 O.S. Supp.
21	2020, Section 6-187), is amended to read as follows:
22	Section 6-187. A. Prior to July 1, 2014, a competency
23	examination shall be adopted by the Oklahoma Commission for Teacher
24	Preparation and beginning July 1, 2014, a competency examination

shall be adopted by the Commission for Educational Quality and Accountability for the general education, professional education and various subject areas and grade levels for purposes of ensuring academic achievement and competency of each teacher candidate or teacher in the subject area the person is seeking certification to teach which shall also include certification as an administrator, as prescribed by the State Board of Education.

8 The Commission, consistent with the purposes of this section, 9 shall promulgate rules and procedures to guarantee the 10 confidentiality of examinations.

11 в. No teacher candidate shall be eligible for certification 12 until successfully completing the competency examination except 13 those candidates who make application to the State Board and meet 14 the criteria for the alternative placement program pursuant to 15 Section 6-122.3 of this title. Certification shall be limited to 16 areas of approval in which the certified teacher has successfully 17 completed the examination. Subject to the provisions of subsection 18 C of this section, testing for certification for subjects in which a 19 teacher candidate or teacher is seeking a minor teaching assignment 20 or an endorsement to teach shall be limited to the specific subject 21 area test.

A teacher candidate or teacher may take the general education, professional education or subject area portions of the examination subject to any limit imposed by the Commission. C. 1. Except as otherwise provided for in this subsection, a
 teacher may be certified in as many areas as the teacher meets the
 necessary requirements provided by law and has successfully
 completed the subject area portion of the examination.

5 2. Except as otherwise provided for in this paragraph,
6 certification in early childhood, elementary, or special education
7 shall require completion of an appropriate teacher education program
8 approved by the Commission.

9 Any teacher who is certified to teach elementary education may 10 be certified in early childhood education upon meeting the 11 requirements provided in law and successful completion of the 12 appropriate subject area portion of the examination. Any teacher 13 who is certified to teach early childhood education may be certified 14 in elementary education upon meeting the requirements provided in 15 law and successful completion of the appropriate subject area 16 portion of the examination. Any special education teacher who 17 becomes certified to teach through completion of an accredited 18 teacher preparation program may be certified in early childhood or 19 elementary education upon meeting the requirements provided in law 20 and successful completion of the appropriate subject portion of the 21 examination. Any teacher who becomes certified to teach through 22 completion of an accredited teacher preparation program or becomes 23 alternatively certified to teach through the Troops to Teachers 24 program may be certified in special education upon meeting the

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1 requirements provided in law and successful completion of the 2 appropriate subject area portion of the examination. Any special 3 education teacher who has not completed a Commission-approved 4 teacher education program in elementary education or early childhood 5 education but who has successfully completed the subject area portion of the examination may be certified in elementary education 6 or early childhood education for the purpose of providing direct 7 instruction and serving as the teacher of record for grading 8 9 purposes in special education settings only.

D. The Commission shall offer the competency examination at least four times per calendar year on dates to be established by the Commission.

13 Ε. If a teacher candidate or teacher is a non-native-English 14 speaker, the Commission shall offer the subject area competency 15 examination in the native language of the teacher candidate or 16 teacher only if the teacher candidate or teacher is employed or has 17 been offered employment by a school district as a teacher in a 18 foreign language immersion program offered by the school district. 19 If a non-native-English speaker who has received certification in a 20 subject area after taking the subject area competency examination in 21 the native language of the speaker seeks to add a certification area 22 in the future and that person is no longer employed as a teacher in 23 a foreign language immersion program, the examination for the 24 additional certification area shall be taken in English. The State

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Board of Education shall issue a restricted license or certificate
 to any teacher who has completed a subject area competency
 examination in the native language of the teacher as provided for in
 this subsection restricting the teacher to teaching only in a
 foreign language immersion program.

6 Nothing in the Oklahoma Teacher Preparation Act shall F. 1. 7 restrict the right of the State Board of Education to issue an emergency or provisional certificate, as needed. Provided, however, 8 9 prior to the issuance of an emergency certificate, the district 10 shall document substantial efforts to employ a teacher who holds a provisional or standard certificate. In the event a district is 11 12 unable to hire an individual meeting this criteria, the district 13 shall document efforts to employ an individual with a provisional or 14 standard certificate in another curricular area with academic 15 preparation in the field of need. Only after these alternatives 16 have been exhausted shall the district be allowed to employ an 17 individual meeting minimum standards as established by the State 18 Board of Education for the issuance of emergency certificates.

19 2. The State Board of Education may renew the emergency or 20 provisional certificate of an individual who has been employed by a 21 school district board of education for at least two (2) years if the 22 following criteria are met:

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- a. the individual has been granted an emergency or
 provisional certificate pursuant to paragraph 1 of
 this subsection for two (2) years,
- b. the individual has not successfully completed the
 competency examinations required by this section,
 - c. the individual submits a portfolio of his or her work to the State Board of Education, which shall include evidence of progress toward standard certification,
- 9 d. the employing school district board of education 10 agrees to renew the individual's contract to teach for 11 the ensuing fiscal year, and
- e. the superintendent of the employing school district
 submits to the State Board of Education the reason the
 emergency or provisional certificate should be renewed
 and provides evidence of the district's inability to
 hire a teacher who holds a standard certificate.

17 3. Individuals employed by a school district under an emergency
18 or provisional certificate shall not be considered career teachers
19 and therefore not entitled to the protections of the Teacher Due
20 Process Act of 1990.

21 <u>G. The State Board of Education may grant an exception to the</u> 22 <u>requirements for all certification examinations for teacher</u> 23 <u>candidates who are "deaf", which for the purposes of this section</u> 24 shall mean having a hearing loss so severe that the person cannot

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1	process auditory linguistic information with or without
2	accommodation and whose primary language and teaching environment is
3	American Sign Language. The Board may grant an exception upon:
4	1. Verification by a licensed audiologist of a hearing loss so
5	severe that the teacher candidate cannot process auditory linguistic
6	information with or without accommodation;
7	2. Demonstration of fluency in American Sign Language;
8	3. Demonstration of competency in the subject area of
9	specialization as approved by the Board in lieu of certification
10	examinations; and
11	4. Sponsorship by a certified deaf education teacher for a
12	mentorship program.
13	The Board may promulgate rules and other requirements as
14	necessary to grant the exceptions described in this subsection.
15	Applicable teaching environments may include American Sign Language
16	immersion programs, the Oklahoma School for the Deaf, programs for
17	the deaf or other classroom settings in which American Sign Language
18	is the language of instruction.
19	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2021.
20	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
21	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
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1	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
