12	An Act relating to children; enacting the Model Successful Future Alumni Act of 2019; directing the Department of Human Services to create certain pilot
13	program; providing for compensation of program participants; directing Department to create
14	administrative position; providing for compensation of position; creating the Successful Future Alumni
15	Revolving Fund; providing for deposits and expenditures of fund; providing for coordination with
16	the Commissioner of Labor; requiring submission of certain annual report; providing for promulgation of
17	rules; defining terms; permitting youth to receive
18	extended foster care services; setting age limitation; authorizing Department of Human Services
19	to provide extended services; listing eligibility requirements; stating voluntary nature of services;
20	requiring Department to notify youth if services are terminated for failure to meet eligibility; directing
21	Department to secure federal funding for services; delegating rulemaking authority to Department to
22	implement provisions; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.
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1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

2 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 3 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-8-113 of Title 10A, unless 4 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. This section shall be known and may be cited as the "Model
Successful Future Alumni Act of 2019".

B. Pursuant to the Model Successful Future Alumni Act of 2019,
the Department of Human Services shall create a pilot program to
improve socioeconomic outcomes for children in the custody of the
Department. The pilot program shall:

Provide cost-effective, in-house employment opportunities to
 children in Department custody or those who were in custody;

Recruit and train program participants to be effective
 Department advocates for social services, while providing program
 participants with self-motivation to be successful and independent
 through employment opportunities in the Department; and

17 3. Increase employment rates, decrease the likelihood of
18 homelessness, and assist children in foster care to effectively
19 advocate for themselves and others.

C. Subject to the availability of funds, the Department shall provide compensation to program participants currently or formerly in foster care who are employed by the Department.

D. The Department shall create at least one new administrative
 position to implement the purposes of this section, which shall not

be subject to the current Department pay scale, and the compensation
 provided shall be no less than the federal minimum wage.

3 Ε. There is hereby created in the State Treasury for the 4 Department of Human Services a revolving fund known as the 5 "Successful Future Alumni Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a 6 continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall 7 consist of monies collected through tax credits and deductions not 8 to exceed Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) and One Hundred 9 Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) respectively, and any other monies. 10 The combined total of tax credits and deductions for the revolving 11 fund shall not exceed Six Hundred Ninety-seven Thousand Eight 12 Hundred Twelve Dollars and fifty cents (\$697,812.50) per year. The 13 fund shall be used by the Department to provide training, support, 14 compensation, supplies, clothing, accommodations or modifications, 15 or any other necessities for the purposes of this section. 16 Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the 17 State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the 18 Department of Human Services for approval and payment.

F. The Department of Human Services shall coordinate with the Commissioner of Labor to provide opportunities for gainful employment of program participants, giving preference to program participants with disabilities.

G. The Department shall submit an annual report of the pilot
 program outcomes and achievements to the Children, Youth and Family

Services Committee of the House of Representatives by December 31 of
 each year.

3 H. The Department shall promulgate rules to implement the4 provisions of this section.

5 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 6 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-8-114 of Title 10A, unless 7 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. As used in this section:

9 1. "Foster care services" means services or programs that may 10 include but are not limited to housing, transitional or independent 11 living, crisis intervention, case supervision, job placement, 12 educational or vocational placement, training, counseling, early 13 intervention and diversionary substance abuse treatment, sexual 14 abuse treatment and other related services and programs; and

15 2. "Youth" means a person who is at least eighteen (18) years
16 of age but less than twenty-one (21) years of age.

17 B. A youth who:

Exited foster care after reaching eighteen (18) years of
 age; or

20 2. Is in foster care when reaching eighteen (18) years of age,
21 may reenter or remain in foster care and receive extended foster
22 care services until twenty-one (21) years of age.

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C. The Department of Human Services may provide extended foster
 care services if the youth meets one of the following conditions for
 eligibility:

The youth is completing secondary education or a program
 leading to an equivalent credential;

6 2. The youth is enrolled in an institution that provides7 postsecondary or vocational education;

8 3. The youth is participating in a program or activity designed
9 to promote employment or remove barriers to employment;

10 4. The youth is employed for at least eighty (80) hours per 11 month; or

12 5. The youth is incapable of doing any part of the activities 13 described in paragraphs 1 through 4 of this subsection due to a 14 medical condition. An assertion of incapacity pursuant to this 15 paragraph shall be supported by regularly updated information in the 16 case plan of the youth.

17 Extended foster care services are voluntary and a youth may D. 18 choose to stop receiving the services at any time. If the 19 Department determines that the youth no longer meets the eligibility 20 requirements provided in subsection C of this section for extended 21 foster care services, the Department shall provide written or 22 electronic notice to the youth regarding termination of the extended 23 foster care services.

24 E. The Department shall:
