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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 56 O.S. 2011, Section 1025.1, as
14	amended by Section 37, Chapter 475, O.S.L. 2019 (56 O.S. Supp. 2020,
15	Section 1025.1), is amended to read as follows:
16	Section 1025.1 For the purposes of this chapter:
17	1. "Area of concern" or "AOC" means an issue that does not rise
18	to the level of abuse or neglect but may constitute possible
19	deficiencies, irregularities or deviations from policies and best
20	practices which have the potential to impact the health, safety or
21	welfare of service recipients;
22	2. "Bureau" means the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation;
23	2. 3. "Community services provider" means a community-based
24	program, corporation, or individual who contracts with, or is

1 licensed or funded by, the Department of Human Services to provide 2 residential or vocational services to persons who are elderly or 3 persons with intellectual or developmental disabilities, or 4 contracts with the Oklahoma Health Care Authority to provide 5 services to individuals with intellectual disabilities through a 6 Home and Community-Based Waiver, except a private ICF/IID;

7 3. 4. "Community services worker" means any person employed by or under contract with a community services provider who provides, 8 9 for compensation or as a volunteer, health-related services, 10 training, or supportive assistance to persons who are elderly or 11 persons with developmental disabilities, and who is not a licensed 12 health professional or any person who contracts with the Oklahoma 13 Health Care Authority to provide specialized foster care, 14 habilitation training specialist services, or homemaker services to 15 persons with developmental disabilities;

16 <u>4. 5.</u> "Department" means the Department of Human Services;
17 <u>5. 6.</u> "Developmental disability" means a severe, chronic
18 disability of a person which:

a. is attributable to a mental or physical impairment or
combination of mental and physical impairments, such
as an intellectual development disorder, cerebral
palsy, or autism,

b. is manifested before the person attains twenty-two
(22) years of age,

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1	c. is likely to continue indefinitely,
2	d. results in substantial functional limitations in three
3	or more of the following areas of major life activity:
4	(1) self-care,
5	(2) receptive and expressive language,
6	(3) learning,
7	(4) mobility,
8	(5) self-direction,
9	(6) capacity for independent living, and
10	(7) economic self-sufficiency, and
11	e. reflects the person's need for a combination and
12	sequence of special, interdisciplinary, or generic
13	care, treatment, or other services which are of
14	lifelong or extended duration and are individually
15	planned and coordinated;
16	6. 7. "Health-related services" means those services provided
17	by community services providers or community services workers to
18	persons who are elderly or persons with developmental disabilities
19	that include, but are not limited to, personal hygiene,
20	transferring, range of motion, supervision or assistance in
21	activities of daily living, basic nursing care such as taking
22	temperature, pulse or respiration, positioning, incontinent care,
23	and identification of signs and symptoms of disease. Certain tasks
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24 that may be performed as basic nursing care by community services

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workers require appropriate training provided or approved by the Department, written agreement by the service recipient's personal support team, and the primary care physician's acknowledgement and specific order related to the task. Under such circumstances, basic nursing care may include, but need not be limited to:

- a. nutrition, including meals by gastrostomy tube or
 jejeunostomy tube,
- 8 b. blood glucose monitoring,
- 9 c. ostomy bag care,
- 10 d. oral suctioning, and
- e. administration of oral metered dose inhalers and nebulizers;

13 7.8. "Supportive assistance" means the service rendered to 14 persons with developmental disabilities which is sufficient to 15 enable such person to meet an adequate level of daily living. 16 Supportive assistance includes, but is not limited to, training, 17 supervision, assistance in housekeeping, assistance in the 18 preparation of meals, and assistance in activities of daily living 19 as necessary for the health and comfort of persons with 20 developmental disabilities;

21 <u>8. 9.</u> "Maltreatment" means abuse, verbal abuse, sexual abuse, 22 neglect, financial neglect, exploitation or sexual exploitation of 23 vulnerable adults as defined in Section 10-103 of Title 43A of the 24 Oklahoma Statutes or abuse, neglect, sexual abuse or sexual

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1 exploitation of children as defined in Section 1-1-105 of Title 10A
2 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

3 9. 10. "Personal care" means a level of assistance provided in the home of an individual to meet the individual's activities of 4 5 daily living needs such as bathing, grooming, meal preparation, light housekeeping, laundry, and care plan-directed errands; 6 7 10. 11. "Medicaid personal care services provider" means a program, corporation or individual who provides services under the 8 9 state Medicaid program personal care program or ADvantage Waiver to 10 individuals who are elderly or who have a physical disability; 11. 12. "Medicaid personal care assistant" means a person who 11 12 provides Medicaid services funded under the state Medicaid program 13 personal care program, who is not a certified nurse aide or a 14 licensed professional; 15 13. "Reported information" means information reported to the 16 agency during the investigative process which may be appropriate for 17 internal administrative action but does not have the potential to 18 impact the health, safety or welfare of services recipients, has not 19 been verified as true, and is for informational purposes only; 20 12. 14. "Specialized foster care" means the home- and 21 community-based service as defined in the 1915(c) waiver approved by 22 the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services; 23 24

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1	13. 15. "Habilitation training specialist services" means the
2	home- and community-based service as defined in the 1915(c) waiver
3	approved by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services; and
4	$\frac{14.}{16.}$ "Homemaker services" means the home- and community-
5	based service as defined in the 1915(c) waiver approved by the
6	Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.
7	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
