10	An Act relating to criminal procedure; creating the Criminal Justice Coordinating Commission; providing
11	for membership; designating chair of the Commission; providing for the election of a vice-chair; stating
12	quorum of membership and meeting requirements; providing for travel reimbursement; requiring
13	adherence to Oklahoma Open Meeting Act; stating duties of the Commission; directing submission of
14	report to Legislature; providing staff for the Commission; providing for codification; and providing
15	an effective date.
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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
19	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
20	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1801 of Title 22, unless there
21	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
22	A. There is hereby created the Criminal Justice Coordinating
23	Commission. The Commission shall be composed of the following
24	twelve (12) members:

The Attorney General for the State of Oklahoma or designee; 1 1. 2 2. The Commissioner for the Oklahoma Department of Mental 3 Health and Substance Abuse Services or designee; 3. 4 The Director of the Oklahoma Department of Corrections or 5 designee; 6 4. The Executive Coordinator of the District Attorneys Council 7 or designee; 8 5. The Administrative Director of the Administrative Office of 9 the Courts or designee; 10 6. The Executive Director of the Office of Juvenile Affairs or 11 designee; 12 7. The Director of the Department of Human Services or 13 designee; 14 8. The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise 15 Services or designee; 16 9. The Cabinet Secretary for Safety and Security or designee; 17 10. The President of the Oklahoma Sheriffs' Association or 18 designee; 19 11. The Executive Director of the Oklahoma Indigent Defense 20 System or designee; and 21 12. One member appointed by the Chief Justice of the Oklahoma 22 Supreme Court who is a licensed attorney with private or government 23 criminal defense experience. 24

B. The Attorney General for the State of Oklahoma shall serve
as the chair of the Commission. Members of the Commission shall
elect from their membership a vice-chair. A majority of the members
shall constitute a quorum for the purpose of conducting the business
of the Commission. The Commission shall meet at least quarterly and
at such other times as may be called by the chair.

7 C. Members of the Commission shall receive no compensation for 8 serving on the Commission but shall receive travel reimbursement as 9 follows:

State employees who are members of the Commission shall be
 reimbursed for necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance
 of their duties by their respective agencies in accordance with the
 State Travel Reimbursement Act; and

14 2. All other members of the Commission shall be reimbursed by
15 the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for necessary
16 travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in
17 accordance with the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

18 D. The meetings of the Commission shall be subject to the19 Oklahoma Open Meeting Act.

E. The Criminal Justice Coordinating Commission shall study,
evaluate and make recommendations concerning the creation of
diversion programs in Oklahoma including, but not limited to,
alternative sentencing, supervision and treatment options for
defendants who commit simple possession crimes. The Commission

1	shall also study, evaluate and make recommendations regarding all
2	criminal justice reform measures and legislation proposed.
3	F. The Commission shall prepare a report of its findings and
4	recommendations to be submitted to the Legislature no later than
5	February 1, 2020, and each year thereafter by no later than the
6	first day of February.
7	G. Staffing for the Commission shall be provided by the
8	Oklahoma State Senate and the Oklahoma House of Representatives.
9	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
