AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to public health and safety; creating the Oklahoma Caregiver Support Act; requiring the State Board of Health to promulgate certain rules; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1973 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma Caregiver Support Act".

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1974 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The State Board of Health shall promulgate rules that require the State Department of Health to:

1. Increase the number of locations in which services to caregivers are provided;

2. Ensure that such geographic locations include low, mid and high economic income areas in order to provide greater accessibility to caregivers; and

- 3. Provide that the locations to be selected shall include schools, city and county facilities in which no usage fee shall be charged.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1975 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The State Board of Health shall promulgate rules that require the State Department of Health to:

- Publicize information to caregivers regarding available services;
- 2. Provide assistance to caregivers in gaining access to available services;
- 3. Provide individual counseling, to organize support groups and to provide caregiver training; and
- 4. Provide respite care to enable caregivers to be temporarily relieved from their caregiving responsibilities.
 - SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2016.
