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L 6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
L7	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
L8	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5087 of Title 74, unless there
L 9	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

22	SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
23	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5087.1 of Title 74, unless there
24	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Oklahoma Department of Commerce is hereby authorized to establish and administer the Oklahoma Pregnant Pigs Pilot Program.

- B. The purpose of the Oklahoma Pregnant Pigs Pilot Program is to create investment and jobs in the pig industry to align its husbandry practices with responsible animal-care values and to offset the costs of compliance with government and corporate policies designed to forbid extreme confinement gestation stalls or crates for pregnant pigs, through the allocation of funds to farms, cooperatives, business entities and other agricultural entities to:
- 1. Update breeding sow pig facilities currently using individual gestation crates (typically measuring 6.6 feet by 2.0 feet per sow) into group housing pens, of a minimum 24 square feet of usable floor space per sow, for pregnant pigs;
  - 2. Fund complete removal of gestation crates;
- 3. Fund renovation of existing space and construction of group housing pens of a minimum 24 square feet of usable space per pregnant sow pig, and related structures, meeting minimum space standard; and
- 4. Fund training of workers on methods of Humane Farm Animal Care Standard group housing techniques for pregnant pigs.
  - C. The Program shall consist of the following categories:
  - 1. Removal of gestation crates;
  - 2. Installation of group housing pens and related technology;

3. Training of management teams on humane methods, technology, and humane husbandry skills;

- 4. Pledge from grant recipient that all uses of individual gestation crates shall be phased out permanently and in perpetuity within three years of accepting funds. Evidence of gestation crate use at any point in the future shall require all grant funds to be returned to the State of Oklahoma. The pledge applies to all breeding sow pig entities, corporations, cooperatives, and farms associated with an individual applicant;
- 5. Additional rebates/incentives for participating farms that make the complete conversions within one (1) year of grant application approval; to be established by the Department in its regulations governing the program, based on a per sow scheme; and
- 6. Credits per sow for sow farms of four pigs or more with preexisting group, pasture-raised, hoop barns, or Certified Humane
  housing, prior to November 1, 2023, not to exceed more than ten
  (10%) percent of the fund total at beginning balance or first come,
  first serve basis.
- D. The Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall promulgate rules governing the Oklahoma Pregnant Pigs Pilot Program.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5087.2 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the Oklahoma Department of Commerce to be designated the "Oklahoma Pregnant Pigs Pilot Program Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce to implement and maintain the Oklahoma Pregnant Pigs Pilot Program.

- B. The Oklahoma Pregnant Pigs Pilot Program Revolving Fund shall consist of:
- 1. Money received by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce in the form of a one-time \$4 Million Dollar (\$4,000,000.00) appropriation allocated by the State of Oklahoma for renovation and improvement of breeding sow pig housing facilities and such other monies specifically designated for the Oklahoma Pregnant Pigs Pilot Program. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce for the Oklahoma Pregnant Pigs Pilot Program; and
  - 2. Interest attributable to investment of money in the fund.
- C. All appropriations received by the Department of Commerce pursuant to the provisions of this section shall be deposited with the State Treasurer to be created or credited to the Oklahoma Pregnant Pigs Pilot Program Revolving Fund. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer

against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the

Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and

payment.

- D. The monies deposited in the fund shall at no time become part of the general budget of the Department or any other state agency. Except for any administration costs incurred in development and implementation of the Oklahoma Pregnant Pigs Pilot Program, no monies from the fund shall be transferred for any purpose to any other state agency or to any account of the Oklahoma Department of Commerce or be used for the purpose of contracting with any other state agency or reimbursing any other state agency for any expense.
- SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5087.3 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. The Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall require eligible applicants to submit information, forms and reports as are necessary to properly and efficiently administer the Oklahoma Pregnant Pigs Pilot Program.
- B. Persons may apply to the Department of Commerce for grant funds in accordance with rules promulgated by the Oklahoma

  Department of Commerce. Applications for grant funds shall be approved or denied by the Department of Commerce in accordance with criteria promulgated by the Department of Commerce pursuant to the

Oklahoma Rural Investment for Pregnant Pigs Pilot Program and hewing to the standards set forth by Humane Animal Farm Care.

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- C. Grant funds may be made available to eligible applicants pursuant to evaluation by the Department based on the following criteria:
  - 1. Preference may be given to the applicants whose:
    - a. swine operations are licensed or registered with the State of Oklahoma,
    - b. employee or contractor qualifications include Oklahoma career-tech certification, or higher education degrees, including associate degrees, or
    - c. commitment to humane treatment of farm animals, with respect to their lives and habits, has been demonstrated, or desire to commit to humane facilities for pregnant pigs has been well documented and expressed.
  - 2. Consideration shall not be given to applications for:
    - the construction of individual gestation crates,
      farrowing crates, or any farm facilities unrelated to
      the humane housing of breeding sow pigs,
    - b. farms outside of Oklahoma,
    - c. foreign-owned farms,
    - d. farms owned by corporations outside of Oklahoma,

e. individual or group pens smaller than 24 square feet of usable floor space per sow pig,

- f. facilities, companies, farms, and cooperatives that will or plan to co-produce or co-locate pregnant sow pigs in confinement gestation stalls in other or associated barns in Oklahoma,
- g. facilities, companies, farms, and cooperatives that do not pledge to phase out completely and in perpetuity within three (3) years of grant application date, and
- h. entities, facilities, corporations, or farms less than three (3) years old as of November 1, 2023.
- D. 1. Any information submitted to or compiled by the Department of Commerce with respect to the financial statements, trade secrets, or any other proprietary information of persons, firms, associations, partnerships, agencies, corporations, institutions of higher education, nonprofit research institutions or other entities pursuant to the Oklahoma Pregnant Pigs Pilot Program shall not be disclosed pursuant to the Oklahoma Open Records Act or in public hearings and shall be kept confidential, except to the extent that the person or entity which provided such information or which is the subject of such information consents to disclosure.
- 2. An independent committee of reviewers, no fewer than three and no more than seven, comprised entirely and equally of qualified veterinarians, farmers, and experienced animal wellbeing experts,

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appointed by the Governor, shall be designated to analyze and
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    recommend projects for approval by the Department of Commerce.
    review committee shall not be exempt from the Oklahoma Open Meeting
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    Act.
        SECTION 5. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
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
