7	An Act relating to revenue and taxation; ordering a legislative referendum pursuant to the Oklahoma
8	Constitution; imposing additional tax levy upon cigarettes; specifying amount of additional levy;
9	providing for apportionment of revenues; creating the Common Education Classroom Teacher Performance
10	Stipend Revolving Fund; providing for apportionment of revenues; providing for expenditure of revenues;
11	prescribing method for expenditure; providing for codification; providing an effective date; providing
12	ballot title; and directing filing.
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. Pursuant to Section 3 of Article V of the Oklahoma
17	Constitution, there is hereby ordered the following legislative
18	referendum which shall be filed with the Secretary of State and
19	addressed to the Governor of the state, who shall submit the same to
20	the people for their approval or rejection at the next General
21	Election, to be held on November 8, 2016.
22	SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
23	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 302-7 of Title 68, unless there
24	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Effective January 1, 2017, in addition to the tax levied in Sections 302, 302-1, 302-2, 302-3, 302-4 and 302-5 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes, there is hereby levied upon the sale, use, gift, possession, or consumption of cigarettes, as defined in Sections 301 through 325 of this title, within this state, a tax at the rate of One Dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50) per pack of cigarettes.

B. Except as provided in subsection D of this section, the
revenue resulting from the additional tax levied in subsection A of
this section shall be apportioned by the Oklahoma Tax Commission and
transmitted to the State Treasurer as follows:

Sixty-six percent (66%) shall be placed to the credit of the
 Common Education Classroom Teacher Performance Stipend Revolving
 Fund created in Section 3 of this act; and

15 2. Thirty-four percent (34%) shall be placed to the credit of
16 the Health Employee and Economy Improvement Act Revolving Fund
17 created in Section 1010.1 of Title 56 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

C. The tax shall be evidenced by tax stamps as now provided for; however, as to cigarette packages of less than ten cigarettes for free distribution as samples, the tax herein levied shall be computed and paid as provided for other cigarette taxes without affixing stamps on each such package.

D. The net amount of any revenue resulting from a payment in
 lieu of excise taxes on cigarettes levied by this section, pursuant

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1 to a compact with a federally recognized Indian tribe or nation 2 after deductions for deposits into trust accounts pursuant to such 3 compacts, shall be apportioned by the Tax Commission and transmitted 4 to the State Treasurer as follows:

5 1. Sixty-six percent (66%) shall be placed to the credit of the
6 Common Education Classroom Teacher Performance Stipend Revolving
7 Fund created in Section 3 of this act; and

8 2. Thirty-four percent (34%) shall be placed to the credit of
9 the Health Employee and Economy Improvement Act Revolving Fund
10 created in Section 1010.1 of Title 56 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

E. No part of the revenues resulting from the additional taxes levied in this section shall be used in determining the amount of cigarette tax collections to be paid into:

The State of Oklahoma Building Bonds of 1961 Sinking Fund
 pursuant to the provisions of Sections 57.31 through 57.43 of Title
 62 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

17 2. The State of Oklahoma Institutional Building Bonds of 1965
18 Sinking Fund pursuant to the provisions of Sections 57.61 through
19 57.73 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

3. The State of Oklahoma Institutional Building Bonds of 1965
Sinking Fund Series C and Series D pursuant to Sections 57.81
through 57.112 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

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4. The State of Oklahoma Building Bonds of 1968 Sinking Fund
 pursuant to the provisions of Sections 57.121 through 57.193 of
 Title 62 of the Oklahoma Statutes; or

5. The Oklahoma Building Bonds of 1992 Sinking Fund pursuant to
the provisions of Sections 57.300 through 57.313 of Title 62 of the
Oklahoma Statutes.

7 The cigarette taxes levied in this section shall be F. collected and administered in all respects not inconsistent with as 8 9 now or hereafter provided for by law for other cigarette taxes now 10 levied, collected, and administered pursuant to the provisions of 11 Sections 301 through 325 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 12 SECTION 3. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a 13 revolving fund for the State Department of Education to be 14 designated the "Common Education Classroom Teacher Performance 15 Stipend Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not 16 subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies 17 received by the State Department of Education from the revenues 18 apportioned pursuant to Section 2 of this measure. All monies 19 accruing to the credit of said fund are hereby appropriated and may 20 be budgeted and expended by the State Department of Education for 21 the purpose of granting stipends to classroom teachers according to 22 such standards as may be imposed by law. Expenditures from said 23 fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer 24 against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the

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Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and
 payment.

3 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective January 1, 2017. 4 SECTION 5. The Ballot Title for the proposed act shall be in 5 the following form: 6 BALLOT TITLE Legislative Referendum No. 7 State Question No. 8 THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS: 9 This measure would provide for an additional tax on each pack of 10 cigarettes. The additional tax would be One Dollar and Fifty 11 Cents (\$1.50) per pack. The revenue from the additional tax 12 would be sent to two different funds. Sixty-six percent (66%) 13 of the new tax revenue would be sent to a new fund. This new 14 fund is the "Common Education Classroom Teacher Performance 15 Stipend Revolving Fund." The fund would be used to provide 16 stipends to eligible classroom teachers. Thirty-four percent 17 (34%) of the new tax revenue would be sent to the Health 18 Employee and Economy Improvement Act Revolving Fund to provide 19 health care insurance to certain eligible persons.
