These 3 4 national assessment experts shall annually conduct studies of the 5 reliability and validity of the end-of-instruction tests statewide 6 assessments administered pursuant to this section. Validity studies 7 shall include studies of decision validity and concurrent validity. C. G. 1. The State Board of Education shall set the testing 8 9 assessment window dates for each criterion-referenced test required 10 in paragraphs 1 through 5 of subsection A of this section for grades 11 three through eight statewide assessment so that, with the exception 12 of the writing assessments, the tests assessments are administered 13 to students no earlier than April 10 each year according to 14 recommended testing protocols and so that the test assessment 15 results are reported back to school districts in a timely manner. 16 Each criterion-referenced test required in paragraph 6 of subsection 17 A of this section may be administered to students at a time set by 18 the State Board of Education as near as possible to the end of the 19 course; provided, if a school district is unable to administer the 20 tests online to all students taking the test for the first time and 21 all students retaking the test during the testing window time set by 22 the Board, the Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to 23 require a single administration of the statewide assessments or that 24 assessments be done in a summative format. A school district may

1 elect to administer any of the tests assessments to students 2 retaking the test assessment at any time not more than two (2) weeks 3 prior to the start of the testing assessment window time set by the 4 Board. All results and reports of the criterion-referenced test 5 series required in paragraphs 1 through 5 of subsection A of this section for grades three through eight shall be returned to each 6 7 school district prior to the beginning of the next school year. The vendor shall provide a final electronic data file of all school 8 9 site, school district, and state results to the State Department of 10 Education and the Office of Educational Quality and Accountability 11 prior to September 1 of each year. The Department shall forward the 12 final data files for each school district and each school site in that district to the school district. The Board shall ensure the 13 14 contract with the testing vendor includes a provision that the 15 vendor report test assessment results directly to the Office of 16 Educational Quality and Accountability at the same time it is 17 reported to the Board.

The State Board of Education shall develop, administer, 19 and incorporate as a part of the Oklahoma School Testing Program, 20 other testing assessment programs or procedures, including 21 appropriate accommodations for the testing assessment of students 22 with disabilities as required by the Individuals with Disabilities 23 Education Act (IDEA), 20 USC, Section 1400 et seq.

Students who have a score that is equal to or above the cut scores approved by the State Board of Education for the Advanced Placement course exams, ACT Workkeys job skills assessment, College-Level Examination Program (CLEP) or International Baccalaureate (IB) alternate tests assessments shall be deemed to have satisfactorily demonstrated mastery of state academic content standards in the

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subject areas for which alternate tests <u>alternative assessments</u> have
been approved and shall be exempt from taking the end-of-instruction

2. Students with disabilities whose individualized education

 Education Act (IDEA) indicates that the student is to be assessed
 with alternate achievement standards through the Oklahoma Alternate

Assessment Program (OAAP) may be eligible to graduate from a public high school with a standard diploma after failing to meet the requirements of subsection A <u>or B</u> of this section upon the determination of the school district that the student meets the following criteria:

- 6 obtains a written recommendation from the student's a. 7 teacher of record in consultation with the teacher in each subject in which the student failed to meet the 8 9 requirements of subsection A or B of this section. 10 The recommendation shall be supported by the principal 11 and by documentation demonstrating the acquired 12 knowledge of the student by alternate measures as 13 required by the individualized education program 14 (IEP),
- b. completes remediation opportunities to the extent required by the individualized education program (IEP),
- c. retakes the exam <u>assessment</u> in each subject in which

3. The Oklahoma School for the Blind and the Oklahoma School
for the Deaf shall be considered local education agencies solely for
the purposes of purchasing <u>and</u> administering <u>assessments</u> and
obtaining <u>test</u> <u>assessment</u> results under this section for the
students attending their schools.

4. Students identified as English language learners shall be assessed in a valid and reliable manner with the state academic assessments with acceptable accommodations as necessary or, to the extent practicable, with alternate assessments aligned to the state assessment provided by the school district in the language and form most likely to yield accurate data of the student's knowledge of the content areas.

G. Students who have been denied a standard diploma by the school district in which the student is or was enrolled for failing to meet the requirements of this section may re-enroll in the school district that denied the student a standard diploma following the denial of a standard diploma. The student shall be provided remediation or intervention and the opportunity to retake the test assessment until at least a proficient score is attained on the test

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1 <u>assessment</u> or tests <u>assessments</u> necessary to obtain a standard 2 diploma. Students who re-enroll in the school district to meet the 3 graduation requirements of this section shall be exempt from the 4 hourly instructional requirements of Section 1-111 of this title and 5 the six-period enrollment requirements of Section 11-103.6 of this 6 title.

H. The State Board of Education shall be authorized to contract
with an entity to develop and advise on the implementation of a
communications campaign to build public understanding of and support
for the testing assessment requirements of this section.

11 SECTION 7. This act shall become effective July 1, 2016.

12 SECTION 8. It being immediately necessary for the preservation

13 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby

14 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
