AMENDATORY 29 O.S. 2011, Section 3-105, is 21 amended to read as follows: 22 Section 3-105. A. Immediately upon the appointment of, the 23 Director, he of the Department of Wildlife Conservation shall become 24 vested with the duties and powers of the management and control of

- the Department of Wildlife Conservation under such any provisions,

 orders, and rules and regulations as may be prescribed by the

 Wildlife Conservation Commission, and in addition thereto shall have

 the following specific powers and duties:
 - To manage and control, under the supervision of the Commission, all wildlife refuges and real or personal properties which are held, operated or maintained by the Department;
 - 2. To appoint and employ such assistants, department heads, rangers, clerical help and other employees as the Commission may deem necessary, subject to the approval of the Commission. The Director shall fix and determine the salaries and wages to be paid under and subject to the rules and regulations as promulgated by the Commission; and the. The Director shall supervise and direct all employees of either the Commission or the Department and may suspend, discharge, station or transfer them at any time that, in his judgment, the Commission or the state will be best served thereby—:
 - 3. To approve or disapprove and pay all legal claims for services rendered or expenses incurred by rangers and other employees of the Department in accordance with the schedules therefor and the rules and regulation previously adopted by the Commission—;

- 4. To establish and maintain a proper system of bookkeeping and accounting under the supervision of the State Auditor and Inspector \div :
- 5. To promote and manage wildlife propagation by raising and distributing the same over the state at the direction of the Commission; to
- <u>6. To</u> capture, propagate, transport, buy, sell or exchange any species of fish, game, furbearing animals and protected birds needed for stocking the lands or waters of the state; and to feed, provide and care for such fish, animals and birds;
- 6. 7. To make a complaint and cause proceedings to be commenced against any person for violation of any of the laws for the conservation of wildlife with the sanction of the district attorney of the county in which such the proceedings are brought, and shall not be required to give security for costs. The Director may also appear in behalf of the people in any court of competent jurisdiction in any prosecution for a violation of any of the laws for the protection of wildlife, and may prosecute the same in the same manner and with the same authority as the district attorney of the county where such proceedings are pending in cases where such attorney is unable to be present or refuses to prosecute such case—;
- 7.8. To make emergency purchases of equipment, materials and supplies under rules and regulations prescribed by the Commission; and

1 9. To authorize the Department to initiate an administrative 2 proceeding against any person as defined in Section 2-128 of this 3 title for violation of any provision of this title or any 4 administrative rule of the Department or Commission. The individual 5 proceeding shall be initiated and conducted in accordance with rules 6 of the Department, OAC 800:1-9-1 through 800:1-9-16. At the 7 conclusion of the individual proceedings and review of the record 8 and proposed finding of fact and conclusions of law, the Director is 9 authorized to issue a final order reflecting the findings of fact 10 made, the conclusions of law reached and specifying the action to be 11 taken. Actions taken may include the imposition of sanctions. 12 Sanctions imposed on an individual may include the revocation or 13 suspension of a license, refusal to renew a license, denial of a 14 license, probation of licensure, confiscation and disposal of 15 wildlife, restitution for wildlife damage and the assessment of an 16 administrative fine or penalty. The amount of any administrative 17 fine or penalty imposed on a person shall not exceed the amount a 18 court is authorized under law to levy against a person for a 19 criminal conviction for the same violation. Actions taken against a 20 person shall not include criminal sanctions or penalties. In 21 addition to other sanctions imposed on a firm, corporation, 22 association or partnership, a final order may include the imposition 23 of costs and expenses including witness fees, travel expenses and 24 reasonable attorney fees. Compliance with the final order,

1	including payment in full of all damages, restitution, fines,
2	penalties and costs, if any, shall be full and complete satisfaction
3	of the violation for which the final order was issued and shall
4	preclude any other civil or criminal action or penalty for the same
5	violation. The Attorney General, in person or by assistant, may
6	appear on behalf of the state in all administrative proceedings and,
7	at the request of the Director, may assist with the prosecution of
8	individual proceedings. The provisions of Section 318 of Title 75
9	of the Oklahoma Statutes shall apply to judicial review of a final
10	order issued pursuant to this paragraph.
11	B. All duties and authority imposed or conferred upon the

- B. All duties and authority imposed or conferred upon the former Wildlife Conservation Director by any statute, rule or regulation of the Commission are hereby imposed and conferred upon the Director until such time as the Commission or the Legislature shall, by appropriate measure, change such duties or authority imposed by said Commission.
- SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2016.

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
