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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 40 O.S. 2011, Section 4-312, as
17	amended by Section 130, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (40 O.S. Supp.
18	2020, Section 4-312), is amended to read as follows:
19	Section 4-312. PERSONNEL AND COMPENSATION.
20	Subject to other provisions of this act, the Oklahoma Employment
21	Security Commission is authorized to appoint, fix the compensation
22	and prescribe the duties and powers of such officers, accountants,
23	attorneys, experts, and other persons as may be necessary in the
24	performance of its duties under this act. The Commission may

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1 delegate to any such persons such power and authority as it deems reasonable and proper for the effective administration of this act, 2 and may in its discretion bond any person handling moneys or signing 3 checks hereunder. The Commission is authorized and directed to 4 5 maintain the existing merit system covering all persons employed in the administration of this act and shall have authority, by rule, to 6 7 provide for all matters which are appropriate to the establishment and maintenance of such system on the basis of efficiency and 8 9 fitness. The Commission is authorized to adopt such rules as may be 10 necessary to meet personnel standards promulgated by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services pursuant to the Social Security 11 12 Act, as amended, and the Act of Congress entitled "An Act to provide 13 for the establishment of a national employment system, and for other 14 purposes", approved June 6, 1933, as amended, and to provide for the 15 maintenance of the merit system required under this section in 16 conjunction with any merit system applicable to any other state 17 agency or agencies which meets the personnel standards promulgated 18 by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services. 19 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 840-5.5, as

20 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 365, O.S.L. 2019 (74 O.S. Supp. 21 2020, Section 840-5.5), is amended to read as follows:

22 Section 840-5.5 A. The following offices, positions, and 23 personnel shall be in the unclassified service and shall not be 24 placed under the classified service:

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Persons chosen by popular vote or appointment to fill an
 elective office, and their employees, except the employees of the
 Corporation Commission, the State Department of Education and the
 Department of Labor;

5 2. Members of boards and commissions, and heads of agencies;
6 also one principal assistant or deputy and one executive secretary
7 for each state agency;

3. All judges, elected or appointed, and their employees;

9 4. Persons employed with one-time, limited duration, federal or
10 other grant funding that is not continuing or indefinitely
11 renewable. The length of the unclassified employment shall not
12 exceed the period of time for which that specific federal funding is
13 provided;

14 5. All officers and employees of The Oklahoma State System of
15 Higher Education, State Board of Education and Oklahoma Department
16 of Career and Technology Education;

6. Persons employed in a professional or scientific capacity to make or conduct a temporary and special inquiry, investigation, or examination on behalf of the Legislature or a committee thereof or by authority of the Governor. These appointments and authorizations shall terminate on the first day of the regular legislative session immediately following the appointment, if not terminated earlier. However, nothing in this paragraph shall prevent the reauthorization

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1 and reappointment of any such person. Any such appointment shall be 2 funded from the budget of the appointing authority; 3 7. Election officials and employees; 4 8. Temporary employees employed to work less than one thousand 5 (1,000) hours in any twelve-month period, and seasonal employees employed by the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department pursuant 6 7 to Section 2241 of this title who work less than one thousand six 8 hundred (1,600) hours in any twelve-month period; 9 9.
