

1 1. At any time from one-half (1/2) hour after sunset to one-
2 half (1/2) hour before sunrise, also referred to in this chapter as
3 nighttime; and

4 2. At any other time when, due to insufficient light or
5 unfavorable atmospheric conditions, persons and vehicles on the
6 highway are not clearly discernible at a distance of one thousand
7 (1,000) feet or less or the windshield wipers of the vehicle are in
8 continuous use as a result of rain, sleet or snow.

9 C. All lamps required by this chapter shall display a steady
10 light except as otherwise prescribed by this chapter. Any required
11 individual lamp may be combined or incorporated with any other
12 required individual lamp if the combined or incorporated lamps meet
13 all of the individual lighting requirements of this chapter for each
14 individual lamp contained therein.

15 D. No lamp, other than a headlamp, displayed on any vehicle
16 shall project a glaring light; provided, every headlamp shall comply
17 with Section ~~12-222~~ 12-203.2 of this title.

18 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2016.
