7	An Act relating to agriculture; creating the Office of Agricultural Special Prosecutors; authorizing the
8	Commissioner of the State Board of Agriculture to employ certain persons as special prosecutors;
9	empowering special prosecutors to prosecute violations of certain laws; prohibiting certain
10	double capacity service; authorizing the performance of other duties; providing for funding; amending 2
11	0.S. 2011, Section 6-310, which relates to agriculture law enforcement agents; authorizing
12	agriculture law enforcement agents to commence certain proceedings with the Office of the
13	Agricultural Special Prosecutors; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.
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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-310.1 of Title 2, unless there
20	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
21	A. There is hereby established the Office of Agricultural
22	Special Prosecutors within the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture,
23	Food, and Forestry.
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B. If funding is available pursuant to subsection F of this
section, the Commissioner of the State Board of Agriculture may
employ lawyers licensed to practice law in Oklahoma to serve as
special prosecutors in special proceedings before the State Board of
Agriculture.

C. Special prosecutors shall be empowered to prosecute
violations of any of the laws relating to the Oklahoma Agricultural
Code or relating to theft of livestock and of farming equipment or
farm implements.

D. An individual serving as an agricultural special prosecutor shall not serve as legal counsel to the Board in the same formal proceeding.

E. If funding is available, the special prosecutor may performsuch other duties as are assigned by the Commissioner.

F. The Office of Agricultural Special Prosecutors shall be funded by each of the Bogus Check Restitution Programs created pursuant to Section 111 of Title 22 of the Oklahoma Statutes through the Bogus Check Restitution Program Fund of each respective county treasurer.

20 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 2 O.S. 2011, Section 6-310, is 21 amended to read as follows:

Section 6-310. A. The Commissioner of the State Board of Agriculture may commission, subject to the approval of the Board, agriculture law enforcement agents.

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B. Agriculture law enforcement agents, when commissioned,
 shall:

1. Have all the powers of peace officers except the serving or
execution of civil process other than the execution of civil process
related to the Oklahoma Agricultural Code;

6 2. Have in all parts of the state the same powers with respect
7 to criminal matters and enforcement of the laws relating thereto as
8 sheriffs, highway patrol, and police officers in their respective
9 jurisdictions;

10 3. Enforce the civil, criminal, and administrative provisions 11 relating to livestock theft, animal health and importation statutes 12 and theft of farming equipment and farm implements, as well as any 13 other law contained in the Oklahoma Agricultural Code;

4. Possess all immunities and matters of defense now available
or hereafter made available to sheriffs, highway patrol and police
officers in any suit brought against them in consequence of acts
done in the course of their employment; and

18 5. Comply with the provisions of Section 3311 of Title 70 of19 the Oklahoma Statutes.

20 C. Agriculture law enforcement agents specifically:

Are vested with the power and authority of sheriffs in
 making arrests for violations of the Oklahoma Agricultural Code and
 in the enforcement of nonagriculture-related crimes in cooperation

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with other law enforcement officers and agencies as authorized by
 the Board and approved by the Governor of the State of Oklahoma;

2. May take into possession any farming equipment or farm
implement and any and all livestock, or any part thereof, killed,
taken, shipped or had in possession contrary to the law. Such
livestock or parts thereof may be disposed of as determined by the
Commissioner or any court of competent jurisdiction;

3. May make a complaint and cause proceedings to be commenced 8 9 against any person for violation of any of the laws relating to the 10 Oklahoma Agricultural Code or relating to theft of livestock and of 11 farming equipment or farm implements, with the sanction of the 12 prosecuting or district attorney of the county in which the 13 proceedings are brought or with the Office of the Agricultural 14 Special Prosecutors, and shall not be required to give security for 15 costs;

16 4. In connection with the enforcement of the civil, criminal, 17 and administrative provisions, shall have the express authority to 18 stop the transportation or movement of any animal or farming 19 equipment or farm implement within this state and shall have the 20 right to enter upon all premises, posted, or otherwise, when 21 necessary for enforcement of the laws of this state;

5. Shall be under the control and direction of the
Commissioner. The Commissioner may, at any time, remove any powers
or authority of arrest conferred by the Commissioner; and

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1	6. Shall have the right to carry firearms as authorized by the
2	Commissioner.
3	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2016.
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
