Page 1, strike the stricken title, enacting clause and entire bill and insert 16 17 "An Act relating to Alzheimer's disease and related dementia; creating the Alzheimer's Disease and 18 Related Dementia Infrastructure Act; providing short title; defining terms; requiring the State Department 19 of Health to compile and update certain state plan; listing components of state plan; requiring certain 20 publication and submission of state plan; creating the Dementia Caregiver Support Group and Education 2.1 Program Development Fund; specifying type of fund and source of monies; providing for expenditure of funds; 22 stating allowable expenses; directing development of program for certain grant awards; providing for 23 annual awards subject to available funding; providing for application and eligibility for receipt of 2.4 awards; imposing certain duties on the Department;

requiring certain curriculum to include specified training; repealing 63 O.S. 2021, Sections 1-879.2 and 1-879.3, which relate to Alzheimer's Research Advisory Council and duties, development, and enhancement of Core Neuropathy Laboratory; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-879.11 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia Infrastructure Act".

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-879.12 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

As used in this act:

- 1. "Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia State Plan" or "state plan" means a plan developed by the state in conjunction with stakeholders for meeting the needs of individuals with Alzheimer's disease and related dementia and their caregivers;
- 2. "Caregiver" means any person other than a paid provider who provides care for a person with dementia; and
- 3. "Dementia" means a degenerative disease of the central nervous system characterized especially by premature cognitive deterioration. This includes Alzheimer's disease and related

- dementia and diagnoses which are similarly marked by irreversible deterioration of intellectual faculties with concomitant emotional disturbance resulting from organic brain disorder, such as:
 - a. chronic traumatic encephalopathy,
 - b. Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease,
 - c. frontotemporal dementia,
 - d. Huntington's disease,
 - e. Korsakoff's syndrome,
 - f. Lewy body dementia,
 - g. Parkinson's disease,
 - h. progressive supranuclear palsy,
 - i. vascular dementia, or

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- j. any other neurocognitive disorder that results in the irreversible deterioration of intellectual faculties.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-879.13 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
 - A. The State Department of Health shall compile and publish an Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia State Plan, and shall update the state plan every four (4) years. The Department shall consult with relevant stakeholders in compiling and updating the state plan.
- B. Components of the state plan shall include, but not be limited to:

1. Information on statewide coordination and service system development for Alzheimer's disease and related dementia;

- 2. Information on education, support, and other available services for Alzheimer's disease and related dementia;
- 3. Progress reports, updates, and measures of improvement or decline in relevant metrics regarding dementia diagnosis, treatment, services, and outcomes as compared to the previous state plan;
- 4. Public policy recommendations concerning Alzheimer's disease and related dementia for state policymakers; and
- 5. Information on all grant awardees, projects, and amounts awarded under Section 5 of this act.
- C. The Department shall publish the state plan on its Internet website and shall submit the state plan to the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Governor, and the appropriate cabinet secretary.
- SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-879.14 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the State Department of Health to be designated the "Dementia Caregiver Support Group and Education Program Development Fund".

The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies deposited to the credit

of the fund by law. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund

- 1 are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the
- 2 Department for the purpose of awarding grants as described in
- 3 | Section 5 of this act. Expenditures from the fund shall be made
- 4 upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as
- 5 prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and
- 6 | Enterprise Services for approval and payment.
- 7 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
- 8 | in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-879.15 of Title 63, unless
- 9 | there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- 10 A. The State Department of Health shall develop a program to
- 11 award grants to nonprofit organizations operating in areas of this
- 12 | state that meet the United States Census Bureau classification of
- 13 | "rural" to support community efforts to establish support groups and
- 14 | evidence-based community education programs for caregivers of
- 15 persons with Alzheimer's disease and related dementia. Subject to
- 16 available funding, the grants shall be awarded annually.
- B. The Department shall develop an application process and
- 18 eligibility requirements for receiving the grants. The Department
- 19 | shall be responsible for distributing and managing the grant awards.
- 20 C. The State Commissioner of Health may promulgate rules as
- 21 | necessary to implement this act.
- 22 | SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
- 23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1280.5 of Title 59, unless there
- 24 | is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

22	SECTION 11. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified

The purpose of this act is to develop a coordinated state structure and state and community response to dementia that meets the growing need for dementia-specific services, research and community education, and caregiver support.

SECTION 12. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-879.7 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

As used in this act:

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- 1. "Alzheimer's and Related Dementia State Plan" means a plan developed by the state in conjunction with stakeholders for meeting the needs of individuals with Alzheimer's disease and related dementia or diagnosis and their caregivers;
- 2. "Caregiver" means any person other than a paid provider who provides care for a person with dementia; and
- 3. "Dementia" means a degenerative disease of the central nervous system characterized especially by premature cognitive deterioration. This includes Alzheimer's disease and related dementia and diagnoses which are similarly marked by irreversible deterioration of intellectual faculties with concomitant emotional disturbance resulting from organic brain disorder, such as:
 - a. Chronic Traumatic Encephalopathy,
 - b. Creutzfeldt-Jakob Syndrome,
 - c. Frontotemporal dementias,
 - d. Huntington's disease,

- e. Korsakoff's Syndrome,
- f. Lewy-body disease,
 - g. Parkinson's disease,
 - h. Progressive supranuclear palsy,
 - i. Vascular dementia, or
 - j. any other neurocognitive brain disorder that results in the irreversible deterioration of intellectual faculties.

SECTION 13. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-879.8 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

- A. In the State Department of Health, there is hereby created an Office of Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia Resource Coordination to provide statewide coordination, service system development, and information on education, support, and other available services. The Office shall provide the following:
- 1. Initiate the development of systems which coordinate the delivery of programs and services;
- 2. Facilitate the coordination and integration of research, program development, planning, and quality assurance;
- 3. Identify potential users of services and gaps in the service delivery system and expand methods and resources to enhance statewide services;

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- 4. Serve as a resource for education, research, and training and provide information on available services;
- 5. Provide technical assistance for the application of relevant federal and state grants;
- 6. Provide technical assistance for state and local initiatives to serve individuals, families, and caregivers;
- 7. Work with relevant State Department of Health staff to recommend public policy concerning Alzheimer's disease and related dementia to state policymakers;
- 8. Facilitate the coordination of Alzheimer's State Plan rewrite every four (4) years, stakeholder involvement in the re-write, amendments to the Alzheimer's State Plan during the re-write interim period, and any progress reports, updates, and other communication regarding the Alzheimer's State Plan;
- 9. Submit an annual report that details Alzheimer's State Plan implementation progress, information on service delivery system developments and gaps, research updates, and resources, outreach, and information to The Advancement of Wellness Advisory Council as defined in Section 1-103a.1 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes, for review and approval. Upon approval the annual report shall be provided to the Secretary of Health and Human Services, the Office of the Governor, the Oklahoma State Legislature, and made publicly available on the State Department of Health's website; and

- 1 10. Facilitate the coordination and integration of educational initiatives for health care providers on the importance and value of early detection and timely diagnosis of cognitive impairment, validated cognitive assessment tools, and increasing understanding and awareness of early warning signs of Alzheimer's disease and other types of dementia and how to reduce the risk of cognitive decline.
 - The Office of Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia Resource Coordination shall maintain on staff at least one (1) dementia services manager. The dementia services manager shall be a full-time, permanent employee and shall be responsible for the staffing and operational details of the Office of Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia Resource Coordination.
 - SECTION 14. A new section of law to be codified NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-879.9 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
 - Α. There is hereby created in the State Treasury, subject to the availability of funds, a revolving fund for the State Department of Health's Office of Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia Resource Coordination to be designated the Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia Research Fund. The Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia Research Fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies deposited to the credit of the fund by law. All monies accruing to the credit

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of the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended
by the State Department of Health for the purposes listed in Section
for this act. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon
warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as
prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and

Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

- B. The awards shall be made through an awards committee of seven (7) members, coordinated by the dementia services manager consisting of three (3) representatives from the scientific and medical communities, three (3) members of the general public, and the dementia services manager.
- C. The awards shall be given annually to selected applicants residing and performing research in the state of Oklahoma in order to support research into the causes of Alzheimer's disease and related disorders, methods of treatment, ways that families can cope with the stresses of the disease, and the impact of the disease on Oklahoma.
- D. Information on the awardee, project, and dollars awarded shall be included in the annual report as defined in paragraph 9 of Section 5 of this act.
- SECTION 15. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-879.10 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

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- There is hereby created in the State Treasury, subject to the availability of funds, a revolving fund for the State Department of Health's Office of Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia Resource Coordination to be designated the Dementia Caregiver Support Group and Education Program Development Fund. The Dementia Caregiver Support Group and Education Program Development Fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies deposited to the credit of the fund by law. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the State Department of Health's Office of Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia Resource Coordination for the purpose of providing funds for the Dementia Caregiver Support Group and Education Program Development Fund. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment.
- B. The Dementia Support and Education Program Development Fund shall be administered by the State Department of Health's Office of Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia Resource Coordination. The awards shall be made through an awards committee of five (5) members, facilitated by the dementia services manager consisting of representatives from the Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia State Plan writing committee.

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1	C. The awards shall be given annually to non-profit applicants
2	residing in the state of Oklahoma in areas of the state meeting the
3	Census Bureau classification of rural in order to support community
4	efforts to establish Alzheimer's disease and related dementia
5	caregiver support groups and evidence-based community education
6	programs.
7	D. The Office of Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia
8	Resource Coordination shall include information on the awardee(s),
9	project(s), and dollars awarded in the annual report as defined in
10	paragraph 9 of Section 5 of this act.
11	E. The Dementia Caregiver Support Group and Education Program
12	Development Fund shall sunset five (5) years from the effective date
13	of this act.
14	SECTION 16. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
