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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 68 O.S. 2021, Section 2357.43, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	Section 2357.43 For tax years beginning on or after January 1,
17	<del>2022</del> <u>2024</u> , there shall be allowed to a resident individual or a
18	part-year resident individual as a credit against the tax imposed by
19	Section 2355 of this title <del>five percent (5%)</del> ten percent (10%) of
20	the earned income tax credit allowed under Section 32 of the
21	Internal Revenue Code of the United States, 26 U.S.C., Section 32 $_{m  au}$
22	which for the taxable year beginning January 1, 2022, and the
23	taxable year beginning each January 1 thereafter shall be computed
24	using the same requirements, other than the five percent (5%) amount

1	to compute the credit as prescribed by this section which shall
2	remain constant, in effect for computation of the earned income tax
3	credit for federal income tax purposes for the 2020 income tax year.
4	However, this credit shall not be paid in advance pursuant to the
5	provisions of Section 3507 of the Internal Revenue Code. For tax
6	years which begin on or after January 1, <del>2022</del> <u>2024</u> , if the credit
7	exceeds the tax imposed by Section 2355 of this title, the excess
8	amount shall be refunded to the taxpayer. The maximum earned income
9	tax credit allowable on the Oklahoma income tax return shall be
10	prorated on the ratio that Oklahoma adjusted gross income bears to
11	the federal adjusted gross income.
12	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
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
