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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-270.2, is
18	amended to read as follows:
19	Section 1-270.2 A. For the purposes of the Advancement in Stem
20	Cell Cures and Therapies Act, "human embryo" means a living organism
21	of the species Homo sapiens at the earliest stage of development,
22	including the single-cell stage, that is not located in the body of
23	a woman.
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1 B. Research on human tissue regeneration and human diseases 2 using adult stem cells and stem cells obtained from umbilical cord blood and amniotic fluid may be conducted in this state, provided 3 that the research is performed: 4 5 1. Safely and ethically; 2. Only on embryonic stem cell lines created prior to August 1, 6 7 2001, and in accordance with federal law as it existed on November 1, 2007; and 8 9 3. Without the use of a human embryo τ including a human embryo produced using cloning technology. 10 11 C. When research is performed in accordance with the 12 Advancement in Stem Cell Cures and Therapies Act, a person or 13 governmental body shall not: 14 1. Restrict public funds designated for the stem cell research; 15 or Obstruct or provide disincentives for the stem cell 16 2. 17 research. 18 D. The State Department of Health shall establish a reporting 19 system that collects information regarding all activities carried 20 out in accordance with this section. 21 E. The Department shall submit a report with all information 22 collected pursuant to subsection D of this section to the Governor, 23 the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives, and the 24

2	of each year.
3	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
