7	An Act relating to missing persons; creating the Red
8	Alert Act; defining terms; requiring the Department of Public Safety to develop and implement a statewide red alert system; providing for administration of the
9	system; providing duties of the Commissioner of Public Safety; requiring rules and directives to
10	include certain information; providing criteria for activation of red alert; providing requirements for
11	local law enforcement agencies; providing information to be included in the red alert; providing for
12	termination of a red alert; requiring certain notification; providing for codification; and
13	providing an effective date.
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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-1990 of Title 63, unless there
20	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
21	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Red Alert Act".
22	SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
23	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-1990.1 of Title 63, unless
24	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

As used in the Red Alert Act:

 "Alert" shall mean the statewide red alert for missing indigenous persons;

- 2. "Local law enforcement agency" shall mean, but not be limited to, a county sheriff's office, a police department of a municipality or city or the Oklahoma Highway Patrol;
- 3. "Media outlet" shall mean, but not be limited to, radio stations, television stations, newspapers and local support organizations; and
  - 4. "Missing indigenous person" shall mean a person:
    - a. whose whereabouts are unknown,
    - b. who is identified as a Native American, American
      Indian or indigenous person who may be at risk, and
    - c. whose disappearance poses a credible threat to the safety and health of the person, as determined by a local law enforcement agency.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-1990.2 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The Department of Public Safety shall develop and implement a statewide red alert system to be activated on behalf of a missing indigenous person in cooperation with the Department of Transportation, the Department of Human Services, any local law

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1 enforcement agency, the Oklahoma Association of Broadcasters and any 2 other appropriate state or local agencies.

SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-1990.3 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The Commissioner of Public Safety is the statewide coordinator of the red alert system and shall:

- 1. Adopt rules and issue directives as necessary to ensure proper implementation of the alert. The rules and directives shall include:
  - a. the procedures to be used by a local law enforcement agency to verify whether an indigenous person:
    - (1) is missing,

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- (2) is believed to be at risk of abduction or foul play, and
- (3) is one whose disappearance is believed to pose a credible risk to the health and safety of the missing person,
- b. the criteria for local law enforcement agencies to consider circumstances in which a missing person may not meet the citizenship requirements of a red alert, but whose safety would best be protected by the issuance of a red alert,

1 the procedures for local law enforcement agencies to 2 follow in initiating a statewide red alert, 3 d. the method whereby information is distributed to statewide media outlets, 4 5 the procedures for the receipt and evaluation of information received from the public about the missing 6 7 indigenous person, and the procedure for the termination of a red alert; and 8 9 2. Coordinate with local and statewide media outlets for the 10 rapid and accurate announcement of a red alert to the public. 11 A new section of law to be codified SECTION 5. NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-1990.4 of Title 63, unless 12 13 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 14 A. A red alert shall be activated if a local law enforcement 15 agency: 16 Receives notice of a missing indigenous person; 1. 17 2. Verifies that at the time the indigenous person is reported 18 missing: 19 the person reported missing is at risk of abduction or a. 20 foul play, 2.1 b. the location of the indigenous person is unknown, or

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warrant additional concern;

the indigenous person has spedal conditions that

- 3. Determines that the disappearance of the indigenous person poses a credible threat to their health and safety; and
- 4. Determines that information which may assist in the safe recovery of the missing indigenous person is available.
  - B. The local law enforcement agency shall:

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- 1. Require the family or legal guardian of the missing indigenous person to provide documentation of the conditions surrounding the disappearance of the person;
- 2. Determine identifying information about the missing indigenous person and any other information which might be useful to the general public in the safe recovery of the missing indigenous person; and
- 3. Report the individual through the national crime information center immediately upon the issuance of a red alert.
- SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-1990.5 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The red alert shall include:

- 1. All appropriate information that is provided by the local law enforcement agency that may lead to the safe recovery of the missing indigenous person; and
- 22 2. A statement instructing any person with information related 23 to the missing indigenous person to contact a local law enforcement 24 agency.

1 SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-1990.6 of Title 63, unless 3 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 4 The local law enforcement agency responsible for the 5 issuance of a red alert shall terminate any red alert with respect to a particular missing indigenous person not later than the earlier 6 7 of the date on which: The missing indigenous person is located or the situation is 8 9 otherwise resolved; or 10 2. The notification period ends, as determined by Department 11 rule. 12 B. A local law enforcement agency that locates a missing 13 indigenous person who is the subject of a red alert shall 14 immediately notify the Department of Public Safety. 15 SECTION 8.
