Supp. 2015, Section 681), which relates to safety plans for school districts 10 and institutions of higher education; clarifying entities subject to new school building construction 11 safety plan requirements; requiring safety plans to follow standard response protocol for emergency 12 situations and certain practices; specifying standard response protocol criteria; requiring inclusions of 1.3 certain measures; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency. 14 15 16 17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 18 SECTION 1. 63 O.S. 2011, Section 681, as AMENDATORY 19 amended by Section 1, Chapter 55, O.S.L. 2013 (63 O.S. Supp. 2015, 20 Section 681), is amended to read as follows: 2.1 Section 681. A. School authorities of the State of Oklahoma, 22 its political subdivisions, and its school districts are authorized 23 to All public schools in the state shall plan, design, and construct 24 new school buildings and make additions to existing school buildings

that afford protection for the anticipated school body, faculty τ and visitors against tornadoes and severe weather.

- B. Each school, administration building district and institution of higher learning in the state shall have for each building written plans and procedures in place for protecting students, faculty, administrators and visitors from natural and manmade manmade disasters and emergencies. Plans shall be reviewed and updated annually as appropriate by each school, administration building district and institution of higher learning, and placed on file at each school district and each local emergency response organization within the district, which may include police, fire, emergency medical services, sheriff and emergency management of the appropriate jurisdiction. The plans shall be submitted in a format acceptable to the emergency agency no later than November 1 of each year. Each school district and institution of higher learning shall make annual reports to the local school district board of education or Board of Regents detailing the status of emergency preparedness and identified safety needs for each school or institution.
- C. The safety plans adopted by school districts and institutions of higher education as required in subsection B of this section shall follow a standard response protocol for emergency situations developed by a nationally recognized organization and shall be based on nationally recognized practices, as may be revised. The standard response protocol shall ensure a uniform

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1	classroom response that is critical to school safety and security
2	and shall consist of four specific actions that active participants,
3	including students, staff, teachers and first responders can perform
4	during an incident. Each plan shall also include measures for:
5	1. Security of facilities and grounds;
6	2. Communication with parents or guardians and the media in the
7	event of an emergency; and
8	3. Safety training for school employees.
9	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2016.
10	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
11	of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
12	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
13	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
