13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 57 O.S. 2011, Section 538, is

15	Section 538. A. The Department of Human Services, through the
16	State Department of Rehabilitation Services, and the State Board of
17	Career and Technology Education shall implement policies and
18	programs consistent with available funds and applicable federal
19	statutes, rules and regulations, to provide appropriate education,
20	rehabilitation and vocational-technical training for persons in
21	custody of the Department of Corrections who are candidates for work
22	release programs, parole or release. It is the intent of the
23	Oklahoma Legislature that such programs will be available so that

said education and training will reasonably be expected to be completed before parole, release or work release begins.

- B. The Department of Corrections shall work cooperatively with the State Department of Rehabilitation Services and the State Board of Career and Technology Education to provide suitable candidates to allow reasonable cost—effectiveness in the operation of said education, rehabilitation and training programs. This shall be accomplished through development of a method for screening and classification of persons in all facilities operated by the Department of Corrections, such screening and classification to be done cooperatively with the above-named agencies.
- c. The Department of Corrections and the State Board of Career and Technology Education shall develop policies and procedures to ensure that education credits earned by an inmate during any education or training program shall be fully accepted at technology center school districts throughout the state and that the inmate may transfer said education credits to apply toward vocational and technical education courses and subjects upon his or her release from confinement.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.
