7	An Act relating to marriage; creating the Child Marriage Task Force; providing for membership;
8	requiring organizational meeting; providing for quorum; providing for cochairs; requiring and
9	defining scope of study; providing for staff assistance; providing that members will serve without
10	compensation or reimbursement; requiring final report; providing for termination of Task Force;
11	providing for codification; and providing an effective date.
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 21 of Title 43, unless there is
18	created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
19	A. There is hereby created the Child Marriage Task Force.
20	B. The Task Force shall consist of twelve (12) members to be
21	appointed or selected as follows:
22	1. Two members of the Oklahoma House of Representatives who are
23	members of the Children, Youth and Family Services Committee, one of
24	whom is a member of the majority party and one of whom is a member

1 of the minority party, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House 2 of Representatives;

2. Two members of the State Senate who are members of the
Health and Human Services Committee, one of whom is a member of the
majority party and one of whom is a member of the minority party, to
be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate;

7 3. The Director of the Department of Human Services or his or
8 her designee;

9 4. The Chair of the Oklahoma Commission on the Status of Women10 or his or her designee;

11 5. The Chair of the Oklahoma Commission on Children and Youth 12 or his or her designee; and

6. Five individuals who shall submit applications to be
reviewed and selected by the Children, Youth and Family Services
Committee of the Oklahoma House of Representatives and who shall
possess demonstrated expertise in the following professions,
respectively:

- 18 a. domestic violence,
- 19 b. child welfare,
- 20 c. child development,
- 21 d. family law, and
- e. law enforcement.

C. The Task Force shall conduct an organizational meeting not
 later than December 31, 2020. A majority of the members present at

1 the organizational meeting or any subsequent meeting shall 2 constitute a quorum for the purpose of any action taken including 3 the preparation and approval of the final report required by 4 subsection H of this section.

D. The cochairs of the Task Force shall be the member appointed
by the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives and the
member appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the State Senate.

8 E. The Task Force shall be authorized to meet as necessary in9 order to perform the duties imposed upon it.

10 F. The Task Force shall conduct a study regarding child 11 marriage.

12 The study shall include, but not be limited to:

Statistics regarding the current number of child marriages
 that occur annually in Oklahoma;

15 2. Laws governing child marriage in Oklahoma;

16 3. The short- and long-term impact of child marriage on 17 children who marry; and

18 4. Other such matters as the Task Force deems relevant.

19 G. Staff assistance for the Task Force shall be provided by the20 staff of the Oklahoma House of Representatives and the State Senate.

21 H. The members of the Task Force shall serve without

22 compensation and without travel reimbursement.

I. The Task Force shall produce a final written report of itsfindings and any recommendations regarding child marriage in

1	Oklahoma. The report shall be submitted to the Governor, the
2	Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives, and the President
3	Pro Tempore of the State Senate not later than December 31, 2021.
4	J. The provisions of this section shall cease to have the force
5	and effect of law and the Task Force shall terminate effective
6	January 1, 2022.
7	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.
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
