AMENDATORY 62 O.S. 2011, Section 3103, is 23 amended to read as follows: 24

Section 3103. As used in the Oklahoma Pension Legislation Actuarial Analysis Act:

- 1. "Amendment" means any amendment, including a substitute bill, made to a retirement bill by any committee of the House or Senate, any conference committee of the House or Senate or by the House or Senate;
- 2. "RB number" means that number preceded by the letters "RB" assigned to a retirement bill by the respective staffs of the Oklahoma State Senate and the Oklahoma House of Representatives when the respective staff office prepares a retirement bill for a member of the Legislature;
- 3. "Legislative Actuary" means the firm or entity that enters into a contract with the Legislative Service Bureau pursuant to Section 452.15 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes to provide the actuarial services and other duties provided for in the Oklahoma Pension Legislation Actuarial Analysis Act;
- 4. "Nonfiscal amendment" means an amendment to a retirement bill having a fiscal impact, which amendment does not change any factor of an actuarial investigation specified in subsection A of Section 3109 of this title;
- 5. "Nonfiscal retirement bill" means a retirement bill which does not affect the cost or funding factors of a retirement system or a retirement bill which affects such factors only in a manner which does not:

a. grant a benefit increase under the retirement system affected by the bill except for cost-of-living adjustments provided to retirees of the retirement system,

- b. create an actuarial accrued liability for or increase the actuarial accrued liability of the retirement system affected by the bill, or
- c. increase the normal cost of the retirement system affected by the bill except as otherwise provided by subparagraph a of this paragraph.

A nonfiscal retirement bill shall include any retirement bill that has as its sole purpose the appropriation or distribution or redistribution of monies in some manner to a retirement system for purposes of reducing the unfunded liability of such system or the earmarking of a portion of the revenue from a tax to a retirement system or increasing the percentage of the revenue earmarked from a tax to a retirement system—;

- 6. "Reduction in cost amendment" means an amendment to a retirement bill having a fiscal impact which reduces the cost of the bill as such cost is determined by the actuarial investigation for the bill prepared pursuant to Section 3109 of this title;
- 7. "Retirement bill" means any bill or joint resolution introduced or any bill or joint resolution amended by a member of the Oklahoma Legislature which creates or amends any law directly

affecting a retirement system. A retirement bill shall not mean a
bill or resolution that impacts the revenue of any state tax in
which a portion of the revenue generated from such tax is earmarked
for the benefit of a retirement system;

- 8. "Retirement bill having a fiscal impact" means any retirement bill creating or establishing a retirement system and any other retirement bill other than a nonfiscal retirement bill; and
- 9. "Retirement system" means the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma, the Oklahoma Public Employees Retirement System, the Uniform Retirement System for Justices and Judges, the Oklahoma Firefighters Pension and Retirement System, the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement System, the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Retirement System, or a retirement system established after January 1, 2006.
- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 49-143.7 of Title 11, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. Except as provided in subsection B of this section and except for persons receiving benefits pursuant to Section 49-101 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma Statutes, effective November 1, 2018, any person receiving benefits from the Oklahoma Firefighters Pension and Retirement System as of November 30, 2017, who continues to receive benefits on or after November 1, 2018, shall receive a four-percent increase in said benefits on November 1, 2018.

B. Any increase in benefits a person is eligible to receive pursuant to repealed Section 49-136 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma Statutes after November 30, 2016, shall be used to offset the increase in benefits provided in subsection A of this section.

- C. Effective November 1, 2018, any persons receiving benefits pursuant to Section 49-101 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma Statutes shall each receive a benefit equal to Seven Dollars and eighty-three cents (\$7.83) for each year of credited service not to exceed thirty (30) years of service.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 50-136.9 of Title 11, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. Except as provided in subsection B of this section, any person receiving benefits from the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement System as of November 30, 2017, who continues to receive benefits on or after November 1, 2018, shall receive a four-percent increase in said benefits on November 1, 2018.
- B. Any increase in benefits a person is eligible to receive pursuant to repealed Section 50-120 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma Statutes, after November 30, 2016, shall be offset by the increase in benefits, if any, provided by this section.
- SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1104K of Title 20, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Any person receiving benefits from the Uniform Retirement System for Justices and Judges as of November 30, 2017, who continues to receive benefits on or after November 1, 2018, shall receive a fourpercent increase in said benefits beginning in November 2018.

- SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-305.12 of Title 47, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. Except as provided in subsection B of this section, any person receiving benefits from the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Retirement System as of November 30, 2017, who continues to receive benefits on or after November 1, 2018, shall receive a four-percent increase in said benefits beginning in November 2018.
- B. Any increase in benefits a person is eligible to receive pursuant to subsection B, C or D of Section 2-305 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes, after November 30, 2018, shall be offset by the increase in benefits, if any, provided by this section.
- SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 17-116.22 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. Any person receiving benefits from the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma as of November 30, 2017, other than those benefits specified in subsection B of this section, who continues to receive benefits on or after November 1, 2018, shall receive a fourpercent increase in said benefits beginning in November 2018.

1 Any person receiving benefits pursuant to subsection (3) of 2 Section 17-105 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes whose benefits commenced prior to November 1, 2017, and who continues to receive 3 benefits on or after November 1, 2018, shall receive a four-percent 4 5 increase in said benefits beginning in November 2018. 6 SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 7 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 930.11 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 8 9 Any person receiving benefits from the Oklahoma Public Employees 10 Retirement System as of November 30, 2017, who continues to receive 11 benefits on or after November 1, 2018, shall receive a four-percent increase in said benefits beginning in November 2018. 12 13 SECTION 8. Section 1 of this act shall become effective 14 October 1, 2018. 15 SECTION 9.
