13	from being adversely affected; providing exception for certain absences; and providing an effective
14	date.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 1-111, is
18	amended to read as follows:
19	Section 1-111. A. Except as otherwise provided for by law, a
20	school day shall consist of not less than six (6) hours devoted to
21	school activities. A district board of education may elect to
22	extend the length of one (1) or more school days to more than six
23	(6) hours and reduce the number of school days as long as the total
24	amount of classroom instruction time is not less than one thousand

2 of this title.

B. A school day for nursery, early childhood education, 3 kindergarten, and alternative education programs shall be as 4 5 otherwise defined by law or as defined by the State Board of Education. Except as otherwise provided for in this subsection, not 6 more than one (1) school day shall be counted for attendance 7 purposes in any twenty-four-hour period. Two (2) school days, each 8 9 consisting of not less than six (6) hours, may be counted for attendance purposes in any twenty-four-hour period only if one of 10 the school days is for the purpose of parent-teacher conferences 11 held as provided for in Section 1-109 of this title. 12

C. Students Except as provided in subsection D of this section, 13 students absent from school in which they are regularly enrolled may 14 be considered as being in attendance if the reason for such absence 15 is to participate in scheduled school activities under the direction 16 and supervision of a regular member of the faculty or to participate 17 in an online course approved by the district board of education. 18 The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to provide for the 19 implementation of supplemental online courses which shall include, 20 but not be limited to, provisions addressing the following: 21

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- 1. Criteria for student admissions eligibility;
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2. A student admission process administered through the
 district of residence, which provides the ability for the student to
 enroll in individual courses;

3. A process by which students are not denied the opportunity 4 5 to enroll in educationally appropriate courses by school districts. For the purposes of this section, "educationally appropriate" means 6 any instruction that is not substantially a repeat of a course or 7 portion of a course that the student has successfully completed, 8 9 regardless of the grade of the student, and regardless of whether a course is similar to or identical to the instruction that is 10 currently offered in the school district; 11

12 4. Creation of a system which provides ongoing enrollment13 access for students throughout the school year;

14 5. A grace period of fifteen (15) calendar days from the first 15 day of an online course for student withdrawal from an online course 16 without academic penalty;

17 6. Mastery of competencies for course completion rather than18 Carnegie units;

Student participation in extracurricular activities in
 accordance with school district eligibility rules and policies and
 any rules and policies of a private organization or association
 which provides the coordination, supervision, and regulation of the
 interscholastic activities and contests of schools;

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1 8. Parent authorization for release of state test results to 2 online course providers, on a form developed by the State Department of Education; and 3

9. A review process to identify and certify online course 4 5 providers and a uniform payment processing system.

Except as provided in paragraph 3 of this subsection, 6 D. students absent from school in which they are regularly enrolled 7 shall be given an excused absence if the reason for such absence is 8 9 to participate in scheduled 4-H activities or programs as approved by the county 4-H educator. The number of excused absences allowed 10 11 pursuant to this subsection shall be subject to a school district 12 board of education's attendance policy.

1. Upon request from a school principal or attendance officer, 13 a 4-H educator shall provide documentation as proof of student 14

participation in an activity or program sponsored by 4-H. 15

2. Students shall be given the opportunity to make up any 16 schoolwork missed while they are participating in activities or 17 programs sponsored by 4-H. Students shall not have their class 18 grades adversely affected for lack of attendance or participation 19 due to their participation in activities or programs sponsored by 4-20 21 Η.

3. A school principal or his or her designee shall not credit a 22 student who participates in an activity or program sponsored by 4-H 23 with an excused absence if the participation occurs during:

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 a.
 the schedule established by the State Board of

 Education for the administration of statewide student

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 assessments, or
- <u>b.</u> any period of time for which the student has been
 <u>disciplined</u>, suspended, or expelled, if the terms of
 <u>punishment would preclude the student from</u>
 <u>participating in an educational field trip or</u>
 <u>extracurricular activity.</u>

9 E. Each district board of education shall adopt policies and procedures that conform to rules for online courses as adopted by 10 the State Board. Such policies shall include criteria for approval 11 12 of the course, the appropriateness of the course for a particular student, authorization for full-time students to enroll in online 13 courses, and establishing fees or charges. No district shall be 14 liable for payment of any fees or charges for any online course for 15 a student who has not complied with the district's policies and 16 procedures. School districts shall not deny students the 17 opportunity to enroll in educationally appropriate courses and shall 18 provide an admissions process which includes input from the student, 19 the parent or quardian of the student, and school faculty. 20

E. F. Districts shall require students enrolled in online
courses to participate in the Oklahoma School Testing Program Act.
Students participating in online courses from a remote site will be
responsible for providing their own equipment and Internet access,

 not be granted for such courses except upon approval of the State
 Board of Education and the district board of education.

F. G. Districts may provide students with opportunities for 4 5 blended instruction. "Blended instruction" shall mean a combination of brick-and-mortar learning and virtual learning environments that 6 includes elements of a student's control over place, pace and path 7 of learning. A student in blended instruction may work on virtual 8 9 courses at home or at school in a blended flex lab but shall participate in at least one unit or set of competencies as defined 10 by Section 11-103.6 of this title at a physical school building in a 11 12 traditional classroom setting which is the academic equivalent of one (1) hour per day for each instructional day in the school year 13 as defined by Section 1-109 of this title. 14

15 G. H. The school day for kindergarten may consist of six (6) 16 hours devoted to school activities.

17 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
