NEW LAW 18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 18-114.16 of Title 70, unless 19 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 20

A. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Teacher Compensation Review and Adjustment Act".

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B. The State Board of Education shall, in each odd-numbered year, conduct a comprehensive review of the average teacher compensation in the surrounding states.

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- The review shall include an analysis of teacher salaries, wages, rates of pay, fringe benefits, and overall compensation packages in the surrounding states.
- If the average teacher compensation in the surrounding states is determined to be greater than the average teacher compensation in the state, based on the Minimum Salary Schedule established in Section 18-114.15 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the Legislature shall introduce a bill to provide a pay increase for teachers to ensure competitiveness with surrounding states.
- Any introduced bill required by subsection D of this section shall not be subject to debate or passage in legislative committees, and shall proceed directly to the floor of each chamber, where the bill shall, within five (5) legislative days, be scheduled for debate on the floor of each chamber, and thereafter, within three (3) legislative days after the debate is closed, shall be presented for a roll call vote on the chamber of each floor. The bill, if passed in the same manner as other general law, shall have the force and effect of law, and shall be effective immediately upon enactment. The time constraints listed in this subsection may be changed by majority vote of any chamber of subsequent Legislatures.
 - SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.
- SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
