9 An Act relating to the State Fire Marshal; amending  
10 74 O.S. 2021, Section 324.7, which relates to rules,  
11 regulations and specifications; requiring the  
12 promulgation of certain rules; identifying persons to  
13 be held liable for violations; and declaring an  
14 emergency.

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

16 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 324.7, is  
17 amended to read as follows:

18 Section 324.7 A. Except as otherwise specified by subsection B  
19 of this section, the State Fire Marshal Commission shall have the  
20 power and duty to prescribe, adopt, and promulgate, in the manner  
21 set forth in this act, such reasonable rules, regulations, or  
22 specifications on matters relating to the safeguarding of life and  
23 property from the hazards of fire and explosion arising from  
24 storage, handling, and use of flammable and combustible materials,  
and from conditions hazardous to life or property in the use or  
occupancy of buildings or premises, as are deemed just and

1 reasonable and in accordance with the codes as last adopted by the  
2 Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission, and not inconsistent with  
3 this act, and to revoke, amend, or supersede the same. Exceptions  
4 to these standards shall be granted to detention and correction  
5 facilities in existence on November 1, 1985, when noncompliance  
6 would not result in a life-threatening condition to inmates  
7 incarcerated in such facilities. All such rules, regulations, and  
8 specifications or any revisions or amendments thereto shall not  
9 become effective until promulgated in accordance with the provisions  
10 of the Administrative Procedures Act.

11 B. 1. Liquefied petroleum gas defined by Section 420.1 of  
12 Title 52 of the Oklahoma Statutes shall be regulated by the Oklahoma  
13 Liquefied Petroleum Gas Board.

14 2. Flammable liquids stored in tanks at service stations shall  
15 be regulated by the Corporation Commission.

16 C. For the purpose of this section:

17 1. "Flammable liquids" means all petroleum products used as  
18 motor fuel and all grades of gasoline, kerosene, diesel fuel and  
19 aviation fuel having a vapor pressure not exceeding forty (40)  
20 pounds per square inch absolute at one hundred (100) degrees  
21 Fahrenheit;

22 2. "Service station" means any facility including but not  
23 limited to businesses serving the public, marinas and airports where  
24 flammable liquids are stored in aboveground tanks and dispensed for

1 retail sales into the fuel tanks of airplanes, vessels or motor  
2 vehicles of the public; and

3 3. "Aboveground tank" means any stationary vessel at a service  
4 station and is located above the surface of the ground or on the  
5 ground which is designed to contain an accumulation of flammable  
6 liquids and which is constructed of nonearthen materials that  
7 provide structural support.

8 D. The State Fire Marshal Commission shall promulgate rules  
9 allowing the use and storage of propane-fueled grills and flattop  
10 griddles and electric wood pellet grills on boat docks; provided,  
11 that the act of using such cooking instruments is performed within  
12 ten (10) feet of a fire extinguisher. The fire extinguisher shall  
13 be installed and maintained in accordance with the most current  
14 version of NFPA 10 (Standard for Portable Fire Extinguishers). Any  
15 violations or penalties shall be assessed to the person committing  
16 acts contrary to this subsection. The owner or operator of the  
17 marina or dock shall not be held liable for the actions of its  
18 tenants or others.

19 SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
20 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby  
21 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
22 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
