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13	An Act relating to professions and occupations; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 698.33, which relates
14	to the Oklahoma Veterinary Practice Act; modifying veterinary training program for rural Oklahoma;
15	updating references; prioritizing students currently enrolled at the Oklahoma State University College of
16	Veterinary Medicine; modifying maximum assistance
17	amount; and declaring an emergency.
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22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
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1SECTION 1.AMENDATORY59 O.S. 2021, Section 698.33, is2amended to read as follows:

Section 698.33 A. There is hereby established the veterinary training program for rural Oklahoma to be administered by the Oklahoma State University Center for Veterinary <u>Medicine Authority</u> Health Sciences. The program shall be developed and implemented in order to provide encouragement, opportunities and incentives for persons pursuing a veterinary medicine degree at Oklahoma State University to locate their veterinary practice in rural Oklahoma communities, and receive specialized training targeted to meet the needs of livestock producers in rural Oklahoma communities.

B. Subject to available funds, each Each year the Veterinary 13 Center Authority may enter into program agreements with up to three 14 first-year veterinary students or currently practicing large animal 15 veterinarians with qualifying school loans, as determined by the 16 Veterinary Center Authority. Preference shall be given to those 17 students and large animal veterinarians who are focused on large 18 animal veterinary medicine, who are Oklahoma residents and who agree 19 to serve in a community as described in paragraph 3 of subsection D 20 of this section, which is determined by the Veterinary Center 21 Authority to be an underserved area for the practice of veterinary 22 medicine. Allocation shall be prioritized to eligible students 23

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currently enrolled at the Oklahoma State University College of Veterinary Medicine.

C. Subject to available funds, each Each student or large animal veterinarian entering into a program agreement under this section shall receive assistance in an amount not to exceed Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) per year for not more than four (4) years for tuition, books, supplies and other school expenses, and travel and training expenses incurred by the student in pursuing a veterinary medicine degree. Upon satisfaction of all commitments under the provisions of the agreement and the provisions of this section, the financial obligations pursuant to this section shall be deemed satisfied and forgiven.

D. Each program agreement shall require that the person receiving the assistance:

Complete the veterinary medicine degree program at the
 <del>Veterinary Center</del> Oklahoma State University College of Veterinary
 Medicine;

20 2. Complete all requirements in public health, livestock
21 biosecurity, foreign animal disease diagnosis, regulatory veterinary
22 medicine and zoonotic disease, and an externship and mentoring
23 requirement with a licensed, accredited veterinarian in rural
24 Oklahoma as required by the Veterinary Center College;

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1 3. Engage in the full-time practice, focused on large animal 2 medicine, of veterinary medicine in any community in Oklahoma which 3 has a population not exceeding twenty-five thousand (25,000) as 4 determined by the most recent Federal Decennial Census at the time 5 the person entered into the program agreement for a period of at least twelve (12) continuous months for each separate year a student 6 7 receives assistance under the program, unless the obligation is otherwise satisfied as provided in this section. If, after the date 8 9 a program agreement was entered into by the parties, a community no 10 longer meets the maximum population requirements provided in this 11 paragraph, a person engaging in the full-time practice of veterinary 12 medicine pursuant to the program agreement shall continue to 13 practice in that designated community; and

14 4. Commence the full-time practice, focused on large animal 15 <u>medicine, of veterinary medicine</u> in that community within ninety 16 (90) days after completion of the person's degree program, or if the 17 person enters a postdegree training program, such as a graduate 18 school or internship or residency program, within ninety (90) days 19 after completion of the postdegree training program.

E. Upon the failure of a person to satisfy the obligation to engage in the full-time practice of veterinary medicine in accordance with the provisions of this section, that person shall repay to the <del>Veterinary Center</del> <u>Authority</u>, within ninety (90) days of

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the failure, the amount equal to the assistance provided to the person less a prorated amount based on any periods of practice of veterinary medicine meeting the requirements of this section, plus interest at the prime rate of interest plus two percent (2%) from the date the assistance accrued. The interest shall be compounded annually.

F. An obligation to engage in the practice of veterinary medicine in accordance with the provisions of this section shall be postponed during:

Any period of temporary medical disability during which the
 person obligated is unable to practice veterinary medicine due to
 the disability; and

Any other period of postponement agreed to or determined in
 accordance with criteria agreed to in the practice agreement.

16 G. An obligation to engage in the practice of veterinary 17 medicine in accordance with the provisions of the agreement and this 18 section shall be satisfied:

If the obligation to engage in the practice of veterinary
 medicine in accordance with the agreement has been completed;

22 2. If, because of permanent disability, the person obligated is unable to practice veterinary medicine; or

3. The person who is obligated dies.

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H. The Veterinary Center <u>Authority</u> may adopt additional
provisions, requirements or conditions to participate in this
program as are practicable and appropriate to accomplish the
provisions of the program or may be required for the implementation
or administration of the program, and are not inconsistent with the
provisions of this section.

I. The Veterinary Center shall not enter into any program agreements pursuant to the provisions of this section after July 1, 2025. All agreements entered into prior to such date shall be valid.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby

1	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
